LOUISIANA-LAFAYETTE PICKED TO TOP SUN BELT ONCE AGAIN

NEW ORLEANS - Four-time defending Sun Belt Conference champion Louisiana-Lafavette was picked to win another league title, receiving eight first-place votes by the league's nine head coaches, as announced by the conference office on Monday.

Headlining the 2012 Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team are ULL's Christi Orgeron, selected as the Preseason Player of the Year, and South Alabama's Hannah Campbell, who was selected as the Preseason Pitcher of the Year.

The Cajuns received 80 total points with eight of the nine first place votes. South Alabama narrowly edged Florida Atlantic for the second spot with the Jaguars receiving 64 points to the Owls' 62. FIU came in fourth with 49 points, followed by Troy and Western Kentucky tied for fifth place with 40 points each. WKU also received one first place vote. Rounding out the poll was North Texas (29), Louisiana-Monrore (26) and Middle Tennessee (15)

ULL enters the season having won 10 of the past 11 Sun Belt Conference regular season and tournament championships, including the past four. The Caiuns posted their seventh 50-plus victory season in 2011 under co-head coaches Stefni and Michael Lotief. Last season, Louisiana-Lafayette made its 13th straight NCAA Regionals appearance since 1999 and the 21st in the last 22 years. The Cajuns rank ninth in total NCAA appearances with 21, 10th with 50 NCAA Tournament victories and 11th for consecutive NCAA Regional appearances.

Orgeron, a utility player from New Orleans, was recognized as a USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top 10 Finalist last year and is on the 2012 USA Softball Top 50 Watch List. As a junior, Orgeron was named the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year and Sun Belt Tournament Most Outstanding Player after leading ULL to its tenth Sun Belt Conference regular season championship and 11th conference tournament title. She finished the year batting .414 with 23 home runs and a Sun Belt Conference and ULL single-season record of 101 RBI - a mark that led the nation in 2011 and ranks third all-time in the NCAA record books. Orgeron is one of only four players in NCAA Division I to surpass 100 RBI in a season. Orgeron also led the SBC in slugging percentage (.886), and recorded the second most hits (87) and total bases (186) in Ragin' Cajuns single season history. She ranked third in the NCAA in home runs per game (0.37) and second in total home runs, second in runs per game (1.21), fifth in slugging percentage (.886), and 21st in doubles per game (0.32). She was named to the Louisville Slugger/NFCA First Team All-Region, was All-American Third Team, and helped team USA to a gold medal in the Pan-American Games in October 2011.

Campbell earned 2011 Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year honors for her work in the circle last season. Campbell finished the year with a 2.51 ERA and a 19-7 record while leading the league in saves with four - a mark that ranks third in the SBC single season record books and is the fifth highest total in a career. She was named to the NFCA All-Region team and

to the All-Sun Belt Conference Second Team. She was fourth in shutouts (5) and wins (19) and eighth in strikeouts per game

Joining Orgeron on the Preseason All-Conference team are teammates Nerissa Myers and Katie Smith to give the Cajuns the most on the team. Myers led the nation in runs per game (1.24) last season and reached base in 58 of 62 games in 2011. Her 77 runs scored tied a ULL and SBC single-season record and she broke the SBC Tournament record for most runs scored in a tournament with seven. Smith has started in 176-of-178 games in her career. The swift moving outfielder batted .352 and was second on the squad swiping 20 bags in 22 attempts last season. Smith has a career .369 batting average and is fourth all-time in school history with 68 stolen bases.

South Alabama and Troy each put two players on the Preseason All-SBC team. USA's Brittany Fowler joined Campbell as the other Jag on the team, and Nikki Hollett and Havden Gann represented the Trojans.

Fowler is a two-time all-conference player who ended 2011 batting .340 and led the team in hits (53), RBI (52), sac flies (5), triples (3) and slugging percentage (.571).

Gann earned Second Team All-Sun Belt honors a season ago after starting all 59 games for the Trojans in 2011, while hitting .318 with seven home runs and 31 RBI. Senior slugger Hollett earned NECA All-Region honors, and her 20 home runs placed her seventh in the nation and helped her post a .795 slugging percentage, the 19th best mark in the country. She also batted a team-high .354 and started every game for the

FILI's Ashley McClain was also named to the 2012 USA Softball Top 50 Watch List. The dual threat at pitcher and in the outfield started all 58 games for the Panthers and notched an FIU single season record with a .409 batting average in 2011. She received her second consecutive NFCA All-South Region First Team honors and was named to the All-Sun Belt Conference First Team for the second straight season.

Also earning spots on the Preseason All-SBC team are Florida Atlantic's Taylor Fawbush, Western Kentucky's Karavin Dew and North Texas' Lisa Johnson.

Fawbush was one of FAU's two primary pitchers during 2011 and was one of the toughest batters in the nation to strike out, going down on strikes just seven times in 103 at-bats.

Dew was a First Team All-Sun Belt Conference selection in 2011 and appeared in 45 games, starting in 44 of them. She led the Lady Toppers with a .341 batting average while adding five doubles, five triples, three home runs, and 19 RBI. Dew's five triples tied WKU's single-season record and led the Sun Belt.

Johnson has started all but 11 games in her career and holds the Mean Green single-season walks record (29) and the career walk record (68) and is fifth on the career home run list (23). Johnson is listed in the top 10 at North Texas in runs, hits, RBI, doubles and total bases.

Christi Orgeron, a utility player from New Orleans, was recognized as a USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top 10 Finalist last year and is on the 2012 USA Softball Top 50 Watch List. Hannah Campbell earned 2011 Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year honors for her work in the circle last season. Campbell finished the year with a 2.51 ERA and a 19-7 record while leading the league in saves with four - a mark that ranks third in the SBC single season record books and is the fifth highest total in a career. She was named to the NFCA All-Region team

and to the All-Sun Belt Conference Second Team. The Satsuma, Ala., native was also fourth in shutouts (5) and wins (19) and eighth in strikeouts per game (5.16).

ORGERON, MCCLAIN NAMED TO USA SOFTBALL TOP 50 "WATCH LIST"

Two seniors from the Sun Belt Conference were named to the "Watch List" for the 2012 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award – Louisiana-Lafayette's Christi Orgeron and FIU's Ashley McClain – the Amateur Softball Association (ASA) of America announced on Feb 1. Orgeron was named a Top 10 Finalist in 2011 for the award, and as a junior she was named the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year and Sun Belt Tournament Most Outstanding Player.

McClain, a dual threat at pitcher and in the outfield, received her second-consecutive NFCA All-South Region First Team honors and was named to the All-Sun Belt Conference First Team for the second-straight season.

CAJUNS NATIONALLY RANKED

On the heels of its 13th consecutive NCAA Regionals appearance, Louisiana-Lafayette enters the 2012 season nationally ranked once again. The Cajuns come in at No. 24 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll and at No. 23 in the USA Today/NFCA Division I Top 25 Poll, both released on Jan. 24. ULL finished 2011 ranked No. 23 in the final NFCA poll and has been ranked in the final poll in 10 of the past 12 seasons.

TWO SBC COACHES RECOGNIZED FOR CAREER MILESTONES

Troy head softball coach Melanie Davis and FIU head softball coach Jake Schumann were honored in 2011 at the National Fastpitch Coaches Association's annual convention at the Easton Victory Club Luncheon.

Davis was honored by the NFCA for earning her 800th career victory which came last season in Troy's 4-2 win over Middle Tennessee on the road. Earlier in the season, Davis grabbed her 700th victory with the Trojans in a win over Florida Atlantic. Davis, who will enter her 19th season as the head coach of the Trojans in 2012, has amassed 804 career victories, with 706 of those coming at the helm of the Trojans. She was one of eight coaches from across the nation at all levels to earn their 800th career win last season.

FIU's first year head coach Jake Schumann was also honored for notching his 300th career win as then-head coach at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

SCHUMANN NAMED FIU'S HEAD COACH

After four years at the helm of the Texas A&M-Corpus Christi softball team, Jake Schumann was introduced as FIU softball's third head coach in July 2011.

During his tenure at Texas A&M-CC, Schumann amassed a record of 120-104, improving his team's win total every season, culminating with a 41-19 record and a Southland Conference Regular Season Championship in 2011. The team also advanced to the finals of the Southland Conference Tournament for the first time in school history this past season, as Schumann was named Southland Coach of the Year.

Additionally in 2011, Schumann became the Islanders' all-time leader in wins, surpassing the previous mark of 112 held by Missy Dickerson. The 41 wins marked the second-most victories in school history behind a 42-11 ledger achieved by the 2005 squad.

TROY HEAD COACH MELANIE DAVIS INDUCTED TO ASA HALL OF FAME

Troy head coach Melanie Davis was inducted into the Alabama Amateur Softball Association (ASA) Hall of Fame in January, the third hall of fame that Davis is a member of. Davis enters her 19th season at the helm of the Trojans with more than 800 career victories, a winning record every single season, eight 40-win seasons, multiple conference championships.

ORGERON WINS GOLD WITH TEAM USA

After earning a spot on the USA Softball National Team, Louisiana-Lafayette's Christi Orgeron helped Team USA to a Gold Medal finish at World Cup of Softball VI in Oklahoma City, marking the fifth straight World Cup title for the Americans.

In October, Orgeron and Team USA beat Canada 11-1 in four innings to win gold at the Pan American Games, giving USA its sixth straight softball gold and eighth overall. Team USA has won seven Pan American Championships (1979, 1987, 1991, 1995, 1999, 2003 and 2007) including the last six. The program has a record of 78-3 since softball debuted in the 1979 Pan American Games.

2011: A RECORD-BREAKING SEASON

Louisiana-Lafayette set new Sun Belt Conference records in 2011. The Cajuns broke their own SBC records in team batting average (.329), runs (481), and walks (295). The 2011 Cajuns also tied for sixth place in stolen bases (96) and tied third place for wins (51). The 481 runs scored is now the 10th highest total in the NCAA.

Junior Ashley Brignac moved into third place for wins in a season (32) to lead the league this year. She also had the most appearances (42) and best ERA (1.50).

Nerissa Myers tied first place for most runs scored in a season (77).

Gabriele Bridges tied first place for most walks in a season (61), moved into third place for most home runs (22) and tied second in RBI (79) in a season. Bridges also set a new NCAA record for most grand slams in a season with four on the year.

Several other SBC teams and athletes made their marks in the league's record books as well.

South Alabama tied fourth for most triples (15) in a season, leading the league in 2011. Florida Atlantic and Western Kentucky each posted 14 triples as a team to enter a seven-way tie for fifth place in the same category.

FIU's Ashley McClain tied for sixth place with her season batting average at .409.

Troy's Nikki Hollett tied fifth place for most home runs in a seasosn (20).

Louisiana-Monroe's Brianna Love, who broke a school record for most home runs in a season (15), tied for third place in the SBC record books for runs scored in a season (61).

Florida Atlantic's Kerri Croney, Western Kentucky's Karavin Dew and ULL's Orgeron all tied second for most triples in a season with five a piece.

South Alabama's Hannah Campbell tied fourth place for most saves in a season with four.

CAJUNS BREAK SBC TOURNAMENT RECORDS

Louisiana-Lafayette broke several SBC Tournament records in 2011. As a team, the Cajuns broke the record for most runs scored in a tournament with 35. ULL also tied for most triples in a tournament with two, one of just three teams to accomplish the feat.

Nerissa Myers also broke the SBC Tournament record for most runs scored in a tournament with seven. Christi Orgeron broke the championship record for most RBI in a tournament with 13 and became one of just three players to record three home runs in a tournament.

13 CONSECUTIVE NCAA APPEARANCES

Louisiana-Lafayette advanced to their 13th consecutive, and 21st overall, NCAA Regional while capturing their 10th Sun Belt Regular Season Championship and their 11th Sun Belt Tournament Championship in 2011. ULL is 9th in total NCAA appearances with 21, 10th with 50 NCAA victories & 11th for consecutive NCAA Regional appearances.

The Sun Belt has sent a team to the NCAA Tournament every year since 2000, the year the league began sponsoring softball.

ORGERON TOP 10 FINALIST FOR USA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN 2011

Louisiana-Lafayette's Christi Orgeron had a stellar junior campaign in 2011. For her efforts, she was named a Top 25 and then a Top 10 Finalist for USA Softball's Player of the Year.

Orgeron etched her name into the Sun Belt record books in seven different categories, most notably breaking the league record for most RBI in a season with 101. The junior broke the record by 22 and led the nation in that category for most of the season. Orgeron also became just one of four players in the NCAA to reach 100 RBI in a season and now ranks third all time in the NCAA.

Orgeron also moved into second place for most hits in a season (87), and tied in the following categories: fifth place for season batting average (.414), second place in home runs (23), second place in triples (5). She led the league in six categories: batting average, hits, home runs, RBI, doubles, and triples (tied).

TWO CAJUNS NAMED ALL-AMERICANS

ULL's Gabriele Bridges and Christi Orgeron were named to the 2011 Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-American third team. The two power hitters paced an offense that led the nation in scoring at 7.76 runs per game and total offense at 481 runs.

BRIGNAC GRABS ACADEMIC "HEISMAN"

Ashley Brignac was named softball's Capital One Academic All-American of the Year by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), an honor given to the top member of the Capital One Academic All-American First Team. Brignac, a (senior academically) Kinesiology-Exercise Science major has posted a 4.00 GPA throughout her four-year academic career. Brignac registered a perfect 4.00 GPA throughout her entire high school career as well. The pitcher also had another outstanding season in the circle for the Cajuns. Brignac, a Louisville Slugger/NFCA Division I All-Region second team selection in 2011, compiled a 32-7 record with 10 shutouts and a 1.50 ERA this season.

FOUR NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Four Sun Belt Conference Softball Players were named to the Capital One Academic All-District Teams in 2011. Louisiana-Lafayette's Ashley Brignac, North Texas' Mallory Cantler, Western Kentucky's Ciara Garcia and Troy's Sarah Shields all received the academic honors.

To be eligible for the honor, a student-athlete must be a starter or an important reserve with at least a 3.30 grade point average. The honor is to recognize the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performance on the field and in the classroom

Brignac was named to the All-District VI First Team for maintaining a 4.00 GPA in kinesiology (exercise science). Cantler earned her third academic all-district award by being named to the All-District VI Second Team this season with a 3.34 GPA. Garcia, a exercise science major, was named to the All-District IV Second Team for maintaining a 3.55 GPA. Shields, a native of Schereville, Ind., has maintained a 3.51 grade-point average in human services at Troy to earn a spot on the All-District IV Third Team.

SBC LANDS NINE ON ALL-REGION TEAMS

Nine softball players represented the Sun Belt Conference on the 2011 Louisville Slugger/National Fastpitch Coaches Association Division I All-Region teams.

In the Central Region, ULL's Gabriele Bridges and Christi Orgeron were named to the first team along with teammate Ashley Brignac named to the second team.

In the South Region, FIU's Ashley McClain and Louisiana-Monroe's Brianna Love were named to the first team. Representing the South's second team was Florida Atlantic's Rose Gressley, South Alabama's Hannah Campbell and Troy's Nikki Hollett and Taylor Smartt.

Schumann will lead a veteran Panthers squad that is just one season removed from an NCAA Tournament appearance. The Panthers will be led offensively by one of the most prolific players to come through program in senior Ashley McClain, a two-time All-South Region First Team member and 2010 Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. The Tampa, Fla. native enters the 2012 season as the FIU career leader in batting average and doubles and has several more records in her sights. McClain set a single-season record in 2011 with a .409 average and led FIU in nearly every offensive category.

In the circle, FIU will rely on senior Jenn Gniadek, who had a breakout season in 2011 with 14 wins to go with a 2.65 ERA. The Panthers also return sophomore Mariah Dawson, who notched a 2.87 ERA during her rookie season. With all-conference players Brie Rojas, Jessy Alfonso and Kayla Burri also returning, FIU will be poised to make a run at its first SBC title and a return trip to the NCAA Tournament.

championships and posted 50-plus victories seven times. The Cajuns lost only one senior from the 2011 squad in Gabriele Bridges and returns virtually the same squad intact in 2012 that finished the 2011 season as the nation's top offense with a school and Sun Belt single season record 481 runs. The mark is the 10th highest single-season total in NCAA history. The Cajuns return 15 letterwinners and eight position starters from 2011, including USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top 10 Finalist and Team USA member Christi Orgeron, who became only the fourth person in NCAA history with 100 RBI in 2011. Orgeron led the Cajuns with a .414 batting average and 23 home runs in 2011 and was selected to the 2011 USA Softball Women's National Team and helped Team USA to gold medal titles at the World Cup of Softball in Oklahoma City in July and the Pan American Games in October. She became the first ULL softball player to earn a spot on the USA National Team and third to compete with USA Softball, joining Alana Addison (2002 Elite team) and Brooke Mitchell (2004 Elite team). Nerissa Myers also returns in 2012 after leading the Cajuns and tying a ULL and Sun Belt record with 77 runs scored in a season. The speedy shortstop reached base in all but four games for the Cajuns as she posted a .498 on base percentage. Myers turned in an impressive .974 fielding percentage, committing only five errors in 194 total chances. Ashley Brignac also returns in the circle for ULL in 2012. She will be seeking the third 30-win season of her career. The 2011 Sun Belt Pitcher of the Year and Capital One Academic All-American of the Year will be joined by three other returners in Allie Chenault, Christina Hamilton and Shelbee Rodgers. Brignac enters the 2012 season just five wins shy of the Cajuns career Top 5 list in pitching victories. She needs just 142 strikeouts to move into second place all-time and would need to amass 322 to join Brooke Mitchell as the only Cajuns pitchers to reach 1,000 career strikeouts. Navarrete tied for third in runs with 33 each and senior Roxy Cassel was just behind with 25, the three accounting for more than a third of ULM's runs. Janel Salanoa comes back for her junior year in 2012 as the player to watch. In just her second season, Salanoa was a force at the plate with a career-best .321 batting average to rank third for the Warhawks. However, her most impressive stat was striking out just five times all season in 168 at-bats to rank eighth in the nation as toughest to strikeout. The native of San Jose, Calif., also had a program record-tying four sacrifice flies which ranked her 18th in the NCAA. Salanoa also ranked second for ULM in homeruns (7), triples (1), doubles (11), total bases (88), and slugging percentage (.524). Roxy Cassel made her way into the record books after a career-best season offensively in 2011. She brought in 44 runners which was three short of setting the single-season record, ranking third all-time. She totals 79 RBIs for her career, which vaulted her into a tie for fifth place for career RBIs. One more RBI this season will give her sole possession of fifth while needing 40 more to overtake phenom Brianna Love in fourth. Four JUCO transfers including three NJCAA All-Americans will bring a strong foundation to a ULM squad which lost 10 letterwinners from last year. The Warhawks are joined by third baseman Haley McCall and outfielder Karli Wainwright from LSU-Eunice, and pitchers Samantha Hamby of Central Alabama CC and Taylor Bailey of East Central CC. McCall and Bailey were both NJCAA First Team All-American selections and Hamby was a Second Team All-American.

Middle Tennessee softball coach Sue Nevar returns for her fifth season as head of the Blue Raider program. Nevar and her staff have once again put together a challenging slate in 2012 as the Blue Raiders will open the season with four-consecutive road weekend tournaments, highlighted by a trip to Knoxville, Tenn., for the Tennessee Classic March 2-4. In all, the squad will play eight opponents who advanced to the 2011 NCAA Tournament. The Blue Raiders will benefit from the return of several key position starters led by senior first baseman Kaycee Popham. The Silver Creek, Ga., native finished second on the team last season with 27 RBIs while tying for the team lead with five homeruns. Fellow senior Natalie Ysais returns for her third season behind home plate. In 46 games a year ago, she ranked second on the squad in both on-base percentage (.385) and walks (17). Meanwhile junior outfielder Nina Davenport will look to spark the team from the lead-off position. The Chattanooga, Tenn., product hit .289 last year and led the team with 28 runs scored while finishing second with 10 stolen bases. Senior Caty Jutson and sophomore Jordyn Fisherback will guide the team in the circle. The duo accounted for 12 of the team's wins a season ago. Middle Tennessee will welcome six newcomers to the program in 2012 who will battle for several available starting positions.

NORTH TEXAS



The 2012 Mean Green team will feature a young but experienced squad. Eleven of the 18 players on the roster are freshmen or sophomores, but they are surrounded by a core of strong and versatile upperclassmen. Of the 13 returning letterwinners, five field players recorded at least 30 starts each in 2011. Senior Lisa Johnson will anchor the infield, while classmate Megan Rupp will man the outfield. Johnson has started all but 11 games in her career, and Rupp has missed just seven games. Johnson and Caitlin Grimes hit a combined 14 of the team's 39 home runs in 2011. Johnson is fifth on the career home run list with 23. Rupp and sophomore Brooke Foster stole 15 of the team's 40 stolen bases last year. Rupp is second on the career stolen bases list, while Foster's 10 thefts last year put her fifth on the single-season record column. Head coach T.J. Hubbard returns for his fifth season. He picked up his 100th career win in 2011, becoming the first softball coach at North Texas to accomplish that feat and finished the season with an overall win-loss record of 104-111 after four years as head coach. In 2011, North Texas set a school record for home wins with 17 and won the Courtyard Classic at Lovelace Stadium. The Mean Green also defeated three nationallyranked teams (Baylor, Missouri and Louisiana-Lafayette) at home. Since the Mean Green started playing at Lovelace Stadium in 2007, North Texas has posted a 67-57 record at home. However, for the first time in school history, the Mean Green did not make the conference tournament in 2011. North Texas struggled on the road and finished the season with only three road wins and two victories at a neutral site. Sophomores Ashley Kirk and Brooke Foster return after strong freshman campaigns. Kirk set the single-season strikeout record and moved into the top five for career strikeouts after just one season and also picked up a Sun Belt Player of the Week honor. Foster came in and secured the third-base starting position as a freshman. She hit over .300 for most of the season and finished fifth on the team with a .276 average and led the team with three triples and 10 stolen bases. She hit .322 during Sun Belt play and went on to earn second-team all-conference honors. She became only the third North Texas softball player to earn all-conference honors as a freshman. Kirk is one of four pitchers on the 2012 team. Junior Brittany Simmons returns after a solid sophomore campaign, sophomore Lauren Poole had a successful fall season, and freshman Madison Thompson will look to contribute right away.

LOUISIANA-LAFAYETTE WINS 11TH SUN BELT SOFTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

LAFAYETTE, La. - No. 1 seed Louisiana-Lafayette revenged a three-game series sweep earlier in the season to shut out No. 2 seed Florida Atlantic 8-0 in five innings to win the 2011 Sun Belt Conference Softball Championship at Lamson Park on the campus of the University of Louisiana at Lafayette on Saturday.

The Cajuns (49-9) earned their 11th Sun Belt Conference Championship in the 12-year history of Sun Belt softball. ULL has won the title every year in which they were deemed the No. 1 seed in the tournament. The third straight crowd of more than one thousand pushed the overall tournament attendance over 10,000 for the first time in the 12-year history of the Sun Belt Conference Softball Championship.

The league's Player of the Year Christi Orgeron was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player after breaking a three-year-old SBC Tournament record for most RBI in a tournament when she homered to left field in the bottom of the second to score three. The top 10 finalist for USA Softball's Player of the Year added to her RBI total with a two-run bomb over the center field wall to give her 13 for the

Orgeron extended her league-leading RBI count to 97, which also leads the nation. The junior from New Orleans also moved into the top five all-time on the NCAA's single-season RBI charts. Her two home runs moved her ahead of fellow Cajun Gabriele Bridges, who tied for the national lead, with 23 on the year. Organo also tied a SBC Tournament record for most home runs in a tournament with three, one of only three players to accomplish that feat.

Joining Orgeron on the all-tournament team were teammates Bridges and Ashley Brignac. Bridges made NCAA history against South Alabama on Friday, setting the NCAA's new single-season grand slam record when she blasted her fourth of the season. The Cajuns' lone senior tallied one of ULL's eight runs in the championship game after she was walked.

Bridges and Orgeron have now combined for 45 home runs, the most by any duo in the country. The duo has also combined for an

Brignac (30-5) moved into fifth place in the Sun Belt record books by recording her 30th win of the season when she shut down FAU's offense. The junior went the distance in the circle, only allowing two hits and walking two while striking out five batters in the shut out. Brignac threw her threw her seventh career no-hitter on Friday to eliminate South Alabama 10-0 in five innings. The no-hitter by Brignac (29-5) was her second in six-days as she shut down La.-Monroe last Saturday.

Also leading the Cajuns on offense was Nerissa Myers, who scored off Orgeron's first homer, registered her seventh run of the tournament, also breaking a SBC Tournament record for most runs scored in a tournament.

The Cajuns got on the board first by taking advantage of an Owl throwing error to put up one in the first. In the top of the second, Draheim hit a grounder that rolled through Carly Speerin's legs at shortstop, allowing Bridges to score. Myers tallied an RBI-single, following by Orgeron slamming her first homer of the game to round in three and move the Cajuns ahead 5-0.

Florida Atlantic (34-25) pulled Rose Gressley (20-13) after the second inning in favor of Taylor Fawbush. Orgeron struck again in the fourth with a two-run bomb over the center field wall to give her 97 RBI on the year. The Cajuns added their final run in the fifth inning when Paige Cormier hit a solo homer, her fifth of the season.

The Owls couldn't get their offense going, only getting two hits in 17 at-bats.

Gressley recorded the loss for the Owls, allowing four hits and five runs, one unearned in two innings of work.
