



## POINTS OF PRIDE

- Louisiana has made five NCAA Tournament and five NIT appearances.
- The Ragin' Cajuns have claimed five Sun Belt Conference regular season championships and three Sun Belt Conference Tournament championships.
- Since 2000, Louisiana has produced 16 All-Sun Belt Conference selections.
- The Ragin' Cajuns have produced 27 winning seasons (out of 36 total) since their first season of NCAA competition in 1970-71.
- Louisiana has won 71 percent of the games played in the Cajundome. UL has posted 10-plus wins in the facility 14 times.
- The last two NBA seasons, the Cajuns have had a former player on a team's training camp roster Dwayne Mitchell (L.A. Lakers 2008-09) and Brian Hamilton (New Jersey Nets 2008-09 and 2009-10).
- The Cajundome is one of the premier basketball arenas in the Sun Belt Conference. A brand new court was installed in 2007-08, then a state-of-the-art scoreboard and sound system were added in 2008-09.
















## IT'S ALL ABOUT

- UL is one of two Louisiana institutions designed as a "Research University with high Research Activity" by The Carnegie Foundation.









- Louisiana's Mathematics Department is one of the Top 100 university math departments in the nation, according to the National Science Foundation. The university's Computer Science Department is among the Top 60 university computer science departments.
- A "Partnership for Victory" between the University of Louisiana and Cox Communications has created the largest sponsorship of Ragin' Cajuns athletics in university history. Cox Communications pledged \$2 million for UL athletics and agreed to a 10-year partnership with the Ragin' Cajuns.
- The Louisiana Immersive Technologies Enterprise is a \$29 million state-of-the-art facility in University Research Park. It features several "visualization" environments that enable researchers to manipulate complex data into workable 3-D models.
- The College of Nursing and Allied Health Professions is one of the the largest traditional nursing programs in the U.S.
- The B.I. Moody III College of Business Administration's MBA program is included in the 2007 edition of The Princeton Review's *Best 282 Business Schools*.
- The University of Louisiana has the only degree-granting industrial design program in the state.

## UL Basketball: Not just Athletes: STUDENT-ATHLETES


- Danny Cottonham, director of the Student-Athlete Academic Center, has worked at UL for over 30 years and has overseen Academic Support Services for student-athletes for over 25 years
- The men's basketball team has seen a constant improvement in its APR score the past three seasons. The program scored a perfect 1000 in 2006-07 & 2007-08 and 980 in 2008-09. That performance has helped rapidly improve the program's multi-year APR average from 788 following the 2005-06 season to 917 following 2008-09.
- For the last three years, almost half of all student-athletes earned a 3.0 GPA or higher
- On average, the Ragin' Cajuns studentathlete graduation rate is 12-percent better than the University's student body
- The Cajuns Graduation Success Rate stands as one of the highest rates among Division I public schools in the state of Louisiana

### **Seating Capacity: 11,550** 25th Season

One of the nation's most impressive facilities and heralded as one of the finest multi-purpose arenas in the country, the Cajundome has served as the home of Louisiana's Ragin' Cajuns men's basketball program since the 1985-86 season.

The \$64 million facility was opened and officially dedicated on Nov. 10, 1985, as the new home of the Ragin' Cajuns, replacing Blackham Coliseum (1950-84), and since that time the 'Dome has drawn raves from across the country for its beauty and function.

"This is as fine a facility as you'll find anywhere," basketball analyst Billy Packer said. "You don't need any better than this.

"It's sensational," said former Utah Jazz head coach Frank Layden, whose team played an exhibition in the arena. "It's the best arena I've ever been in. I'd like to take it home with me."

"The Cajundome is a facility that the University of Louisiana, the city of Lafayette and the state of Louisiana should be very proud of," Cajuns head coach Robert Lee said. "It's one of the truly magnificent facilities in the country. I've traveled throughout the country and played in a lot of great coliseums, and the Cajundome is as nice, if not nicer, than any place I've ever been in."

The Cajundome is much more than a basketball arena, though.

It was designed as a true multi-purpose facility, and the 'Dome has hosted such varied events as ice shows, circuses, indoor soccer, conventions, banquets, wrestling and boxing cards, ice hockey, Arena Football, monster truck shows and rodeos. The facility served as home for the Louisiana IceGators of the East Coast Hockey League from the 1995-96 through 2004-05 seasons. For one season, in 2001, the af2's Lafayette Roughnecks called the Cajundome home.

The facility has an adjustable capacity between 4,500 and 13,500. With an average of 140 events per year and 10-15 concerts per year, the arena has hosted top entertainers and shows including The Eagles, Whitney Houston, Rod Stewart, Elton John, Billy Joel, George Strait, Garth Brooks, Eddie Murphy, Backstreet Boys, Disney's World On Ice, WWF, Sesame Street, Clear Channel Motor Sports, Faith Hill, Tim McGraw, NSYNC, Hannah Montana, Taylor Swift and The Professional Bull Riders Adriano Moraes Invitational.

The Cajundome features chairback seating throughout the arena with a capacity of 11,550 for UL basketball and more for events that do not fill the entire floor space. The largest crowd for any single event was the 13,500 fans who attended the Kenny Rogers concert during the facility's first week of operation.

The 'Dome also features 16 plush VIP luxury suites with full view of the arena.

A brand new basketball court was installed in time for the 2007-08 season. More upgrades were installed for the 2008-09 season which included a new scoreboard and sound

system.

times the arena has served as host of the Sun Belt Conference men's basketball tournament doing so in 1997, 1998 and 2007. The 2007 Sun Belt **Tournament** added a twist - the men's tournament was joined by the women's tournament, marking the first time the 'Dome hosted the league's women's postseason

The city of Lafayette and the State of Louisiana jointly financed and built the Cajundome. The state owns the land on the 'Dome site, located just east of the University of Louisiana's Cox Communications Athletic Center off Congress Street and Cajundome Boulevard.

On April 30, 2002, the facility received a much needed addition with the opening of the brand new \$16.7 million convention center located adjacent to the 'Dome on the east side of the building. The convention center offers nearly 100,000 square feet on two levels..

The largest crowd to date for a Ragin' Cajuns basketball game in the facility came on Dec. 16, 1992, when 11,479 fans watched UL defeat Loyola-Marymount 87-73.

During their tenure in the Cajundome, the Ragin' Cajuns have posted a 228-94 record for a .708 winning

During the 2002-03 season, the Cajuns set a new record for consecutive wins at the 'Dome after an 81-74 win over New Mexico State on Jan. 2, 2003. That win marked the 15th straight at the Cajundome. The streak would eventually reach 21, which ranked as the fifth-longest in the nation at the time, before falling to Western Kentucky on Feb. 26, 2003.

The 2005-06 season was shortened. The Cajundome served as a shelter for Hurricanes Katrina and Rita and was unavailable in November and December 2005. The Cajuns returned to the arena in January 2006.

## INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY

- A new era of Ragin' Cajuns facilities was born in August 2007 when the multi-purpose Leon Moncla Indoor Practice Facility was unveiled.
- The 88,791-square foot facility was built by architect Gene Sellers for approximately \$4.5 million.
- The facility houses a full 120-yard football field turf surface purchased from the New Orleans Saints that was used during the 2003 NFL season. The turf was also used for the New Orleans Bowl and Sugar Bowl National Championship game.
- Drop-down batting cages hang above the west end zone and are utilized by the baseball, softball and golf teams. Baseball and softball have also used the turf to take infield practice.
- The basketball portion includes a full court with six goals, locker room, video room, players lounge and meeting room. The basketball court was taken from the Cajundome and was replaced by a court used in the NCAA Women's Basketball National Championship game.

The old saying is that "familiarity breeds contempt." The 2009-10 version of the Ragin' Cajuns men's basketball team hopes that they can change that to "familiarity breeds WINNING."

Louisiana didn't have to hold an orientation when the team reported for the start of the Fall 2009 semester. Head Coach Robert Lee returned all but two letterwinners from his 2008-09 squad – a total which represents a return of at least 90 percent in every statistical category.

Lee's sixth squad will be a veteran one. There will be a total of 12 upperclassmen.

The main core of the squad – Travis Bureau, Randell Daigle, La'Rvan Gary, Chris Gradnigo and **Tyren Johnson** – has two years experience working together. UL will have to wait for Gary to fully recover from a knee injury suffered in last season's Sun Belt Tournament.

The squad's top defender, **Brandon Dison**, is expected to be back.

With an experienced bench added to the mix, this might be the year Louisiana turns the corner and makes a charge for the top of the Sun Belt Conference.

To do so, though, UL will have to stay clear of the problems which plagued the team last season – injuries, inconsistent shooting, rebounding deficiencies and suspect defense.

Expect the offense to be fueled by the "Triple Threat" of Bureau, Daigle and Gradnigo. Each averaged double figures in '08-09 and a repeat performance is not out of the realm of possibility.

The Cajuns will need to identify a "go-to" guy out of the group. Many of the inconsistencies last season evolved from roles changing from game-to-game.

Point guard play and rebounding will be areas the squad needs work. Lee would prefer Daigle be at shooting guard, but neither **Ryan McCoy** nor **Willie Lago** took control of the point guard slot in '08-09. Expect freshman Raymone Andrews to challenge for minutes.

Losing Emmanuel Adeife (eligibility exhausted) and Jeremy Barr (transfer) leaves holes in the post. Freshman Javan Mitchell is expected to contribute alongside Courtney Wallace.

UL has the pieces to the puzzle. With good fortune, the 2009-10 season could be special. Remember, just two seasons ago, this same team won the SBC West in their rookie campaign.







Nicholls State (1990-91) – Student Assistant Opelousas (La.) High School (1992-96) – Head Coach Louisiana (1996-2004) – Assistant Coach Louisiana (2004-present) – Head Coach **Robert Lee** returns to the sidelines with Louisiana's Ragin' Cajuns for his sixth season as head coach and 14th season overall in 2009-10.

Having been with the Ragin' Cajuns for such a long period of time, Lee has seen the program through good times and bad times. There have been 20-win seasons that led to conference titles and postseason appearances and then losing seasons which left the program looking for answers.

He has experienced the whole gamut of emotions.

What he has been focused on is making sure that the program is on solid ground both on the court and in the classroom.

The Ragin' Cajuns academic standing was unstable when Lee took over as the top boss in 2004-05 and from day one he has worked toward creating stability and satisfactory results.

Louisiana has seen a constant improvement in its APR score the past two seasons. The program scored a perfect 1,000 in 2006-07 and 2007-08 and and registered a 980 in 2008-09. That performance has helped rapidly improve the program's multi-year APR average from 788 following the 2005-06 season to 917 following 2008-09.

The score during the 2008-09 academic year has moved the multi-year APR average above 900 (917 actual) and put UL on pace to move out of the historical penalty structure of APR pending 2009-10 results, completing Lee's mission of solid academic standing.

With a nucleus of players in their third season together – the same group which won the Sun Belt West title in 2007-08 – the Ragin' Cajuns chances of reaching Lee's goal of a successful oncourt product could be reached.

Lee will have his most experienced squad on the court in 2009-10 as there are nine seniors on the roster.

Last year it seemed as though UL might have veered off course in terms of success on court, but one has to remember that Lee had to deal with injuries to several players that added up to a total of 61 games lost to injury/illness.

Throughout his first five years as head coach Lee has been able to make late season adjustments in the team's style of play to fit his personnel – a trait which makes him one of the top strategists in the Sun Belt Conference.

In 2007-08, behind a young nucleus, the Cajuns battled back from a slow start to finish the regular season 6-2 and add the title of SBC West Champs.

In 2005-06, UL was sitting at 5-14 at the end of January and could have mailed it in down the stretch. Lee wouldn't allow his team to do so. He took a group of guys and taught them to value the "team" concept. The end result was his squad ending the regular season 7-1 in February and advancing to the semifinals of the SBC Tournament.

More valuable in Lee's character is importance on preparing young men for the future.

More memorable than wins and losses in the 2005-06 season was Lee's molding of Michael Southall into a dominant basketball player once more. Southall who had spent the previous two seasons away from basketball with off-court issues was given a second chance with the Ragin' Cajuns. Lee looked at it as an opportunity for a young man to prepare for the future. The chance given to Southall allowed him to play competitively once more to improve his chances at a spot in the NBA and allowed Lee to teach him the values of being a well-rounded citizen.

Lee's defensive philosophy has paid dividends. His 2007-08 squad held opponents to 65.8 points per game – the lowest for UL since moving to Division I.

An added boost for the program came during the recruiting season. The 2008-09 signing class was named best in the Sun Belt Conference, according to The Hoop Scoop.

Even though Lee has only been the UL head coach for five full seasons, he has already laid down the foundation for a program that will focus on winning in the game of life first and letting the chips fall where they may on the basketball court.

#### The Basics

The veteran of the Ragin' Cajuns men's basketball staff, now in his 14th season with the program overall and sixth season as the head coach, Robert Lee was elevated to the position of head coach on Aug. 17, 2004, when he was officially introduced as the program's top boss after an eight-year stint as a valued assistant.

Lee, 41, is a New Roads, La., native and 1991 graduate of Nicholls State University in Thibodaux, La.

He spent eight seasons as an assistant coach at Louisiana serving on the staffs of former head coaches Marty Fletcher (1996-97) and Jessie Evans (1997-2004) before taking over as head coach prior to the 2004-05 season.

During his tenure at Louisiana, Lee has been a part of a program which has advanced to the Sun Belt Tournament semifinals four times, won the Sun Belt Tournament in 2000, advanced to the NCAA Tournament once and NIT twice, while claiming three Sun Belt West Division championships.

#### **Prior to Louisiana**

Lee joined the Ragin' Cajuns basketball program during the summer of 1996 after serving four years as head coach at nearby Opelousas High School.

Lee guided OHS to four consecutive 20-win seasons including a 29-5 mark in his final season in 1995-96, which also included a berth in the state Class 4A guarterfinals.

Before launching his coaching career at Opelousas High, Lee served for one year as a student assistant at Nicholls State in 1990-91 under head coach Rickey Broussard.

- >> Chris Gradnigo led Louisiana in scoring for the second straight season as he averaged 13.3 points, overall, and 14.3 in Sun Belt games.
- >> UL saw three players average double figure point totals, a season after having none joining Gradnigo were **Travis Bureau** (12.4 ppg) and **Randell Daigle** (11.3 ppg).
- >> The Cajuns shot 67.6 percent from the free throw line the best of the Robert Lee Era and highest since 2003-04 (68.9%).
- >> As a team, Louisiana shot 41.6 percent from the floor, extending the program's streak to 33 straight seasons seasons shooting better than 40 percent.
- >> The Cajuns played 16 home games the most since 1997-98. UL finished 9-7, recording the 14th straight season with a .500 record or better in the Cajundome. >> Injuries took their toll on the Cajuns in 2008-09. In all, a total of 61 games were lost to injury/illness.
- >> The combination of Bureau, Daigle and Gradnigo fueled the Louisiana offense as they combined to average 37 points of the Cajuns' 66.6 average (55%) and 148 three-point field goals made out of UL's 205 (72%).
- >> Six Cajuns made 70-plus field goals with Gradnigo (124) and Bureau (113) going over 100 makes.
- >> Chris Gradnigo reached 500 career points at Florida Atlantic (Jan. 31). Later in the season, he moved past 600 points after a 29-point outburst against Troy on Feb. 26. >> Travis Bureau reached career point No. 500 during the

Sun Belt Tournament FirstRound Game with FIU.

- >> In five games against WKU, UALR and Troy, combined, **Chris Gradnigo** averaged 21.4 points and shot 38-of-64 (10-of-19 three-point range).
- >> Louisiana was a team that played the percentages seven of 10 wins came when leading at the half. Eight of the 10 wins came when out-rebounding the opposition.
- >> During the first three weeks of January, **Chris Gradnigo** shot 45-of-87 (52 percent) over seven games and made at least six field goals in five of the games. He averaged 16.6 points per game during the stretch.
- >> Louisiana made 205 treys, marking the second straight season of 200-plus. In Sun Belt games, the Ragin' Cajuns ranked fourth for three-pointers made per game (6.8).
- >> Louisiana committed 13 or fewer turnovers in 11 of the last 13 games. UL finished the season with 419 turnovers, fewest since 2003-04.



### The Story Behind the Nickname

Referred to as the **Ragin' Cajuns**, the University of Louisiana has perhaps the most unique and fitting nickname in all of collegiate athletics.

In 1921, the University adopted the nickname and mascot Bulldogs. Beginning in 1963, Louisiana-Lafayette football teams were dubbed the "Raging Cajuns" by then-Sports Information Director Bob Henderson and head football coach Russ Faulkinberry. In addition, the team switched from gold helmets to white helmets with an Acadian flag. At the time, more than 90 percent of Faulkinberry's teams were composed of Louisiana high school players, many with French-speaking Acadian backgrounds.

The "Raging Cajuns" nickname stuck, and in 1967 the second 'g' was dropped to form the word Ragin'. In the early 1970's other sports teams began to adopt the Ragin' Cajuns nickname. The University made a full switch to Ragin' Cajuns during the 1974-75 school year as part of "Operation Turnaround".

In fact, the Ragin' Cajuns were voted as the best collegiate team nickname by **Sporting News** in 1998 and by an ESPN SportsNation survey in 2006.

### **University History**

**1898:** Louisiana lawmakers approved the creation of an "Industrial Institute and academy" in the 13th Senatorial District.

**1900:** Dr. Edwin L. Stephens was named the first president of SLII, the **Southwestern Louisiana Industrial Institute**, which was to be located on the outskirts of Lafayette on 25 acres of donated land. SLII opened its doors on Sept. 18, 1901, with 100 students and eight faculty members.

**1903:** Eighteen students were the first to graduate from SLII.

**1921:** SLII became **Southwestern Louisiana Institute (SLI)** when it was designated as one of the state's institutions of higher learning. The year before, it had began offering a four-year course that culminated with a bachelor's of arts degree.

**1960:** SLI became the **University of Southwestern Louisiana (USL)** when it achieved university status.

**1999:** USL was renamed the **University of Louisiana at Lafayette (UL)**. The new name better reflects its status as the state's second-largest university and an institution with statewide and national - rather than regional - influence.

### **Men's and Women's Scoring First**

Since the NCAA women's basketball records began in 1982, the University of Louisiana is the only school in NCAA history to have a men's individual scoring champion and women's individual scoring champion.

In 1972, **Dwight "Bo" Lamar** led the nation in scoring with 36.3 points per game (29 games, 1,054 pts). However, that was not the first time. In 1971, Lamar led the college division in scoring. He is the only player in NCAA history to lead the nation in scoring at both the college and university divisions.

In 1990, **Kim Perrot** led the nation in scoring with 30.0 points per game (28 games, 841 pts). For a scoring champion, Perrot made the second-most three-point field goals since women's records began in 1982.

### **Highest National Rankings**

During that time as a member of the NAIA's Gulf States Conference, the then-USL Bulldogs finished in the "Top Ten" of the national rankings for College-Division teams. The Bulldogs were ranked 10th in the 1960-61 poll conducted by the United Press International (UPI) and was, at the time, the highest season-ending rating in program history.

However, that would change under the tutelage of Beryl Shipley in the early 1970s. The Cajuns finished the 1971-72 campaign ranked 8th overall in both the final UPI and Associated Press polls. The following season, the Cajuns made a one-spot jump, finishing 7th nationally in the UPI and AP polls.

### **Conference History**

Louisiana will compete in its 19th season of Sun Belt Conference basketball during the 2009-10 season. The Ragin' Cajuns joined the leauge when the American South and Sun Belt conferences merged prior to the 1991-92 basketball season.

The Ragin' Cajuns compete with full-time Sun Belt members Arkansas-Little Rock, Arkansas State, Denver, Florida Atlantic, Florida International, Louisiana-Monroe, Middle Tennessee, New Orleans, North Texas, South Alabama, Troy and Western Kentucky.

UL's conference history in basketball dates back to the Louisiana Intercollegiate Athletic Association (1914-25). UL then joined the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association (1926-41) before moving back to the Louisiana Intercollegiate Conference (1941-47). The Cajuns became a charter member of the new Gulf States Conference in time for the 1947-48 season. UL was also a member of the Southland (1971-73; 1975-82) and American South Conferences (1987-91). UL was an NCAA Independent from 1982-87.



#### 10 • DWIGHT "BO" LAMAR

Guard (1970-73)

#### UL's All-Time Leading Scorer Led Nation in Scoring in 1972 (36.3 PPG) Ranks Fifth All-Time in NCAA Scoring 1971-1972-1973 Consensus All-America

The "star of stars" in the Louisiana-Lafayette basketball annals, **Dwight "Bo" Lamar** is the Cajuns all-time leading scorer and ranks second in NCAA history in scoring.

The 6-foot native of Columbus, Ohio, is the only player in NCAA history to lead both the college and university divisions in scoring. He totaled 3,493 points and averaged 31.2 points per game in his four years, making him the second-leading scorer in Louisiana history behind Pete Maravich.

He was named to every major All-America team his final three years, one year in the college division and two in the university division.

Besides his 33 school individual game, season and career scoring records, his most memorable achievement was his 62-point effort in a game against then-Northeast Louisiana on Feb. 25, 1971 in Blackham Coliseum.

Lamar, a sophomore at the time, had an average first half by Bo standards with 22 points. But he scored 33 in the second half, as he single-handedly brought the Cajuns back from a six-point deficit in the final 35 seconds of regulation.

Long time official Jim Harvey who witnessed the peformance first-hand said, "From an officiating standpoint, you don't pay much attention to who's doing all the scoring. But I don't think I've ever worked a game like he had. He's got to be one of the best outside shooter's I've ever seen."

In his final three years, the Ragin' Cajuns had a 74-13 record, second only to UCLA as the Cajuns climbed to No. 4 in the country and appeared in two NCAA Tournaments.

#### 14 • MARVIN WINKLER

Guard (1967-70)

#### UL's Third All-Time Leading Scorer First Player to have number retired 1970 Associated Press Little All-America

The No. 3 all-time leading scorer in Louisiana-Lafayette history behind Dwight "Bo" Lamar and Andrew Toney, **Marvin Winkler** led his teams to a composite record of 75-31 and in his four years the Cajuns either won or tied for the Gulf States Conference title each year.

The 6-foot native of Indianapolis, Ind., played on teams with records of 20-11, 19-5, 20-5, 16-10. Winkler was an all-stater in Indiana and a star at Washington High where he broke Oscar Robertson's city scoring records.

He played for the Cajuns from 1966-70 when then-USL participated in the college division and scored what was then a school record 2,128 points and offered 580 assists.

He was chosen for the Associated Press Little All-America Team following his senior year when he averaged 25.6 points per game. He was also named to the All-Gulf South Conference team his final three years.

He was also chosen for Basketball News' All-South Team twice – a team which included university as well as college division players.

Winkler was the first to have his number withdrawn from action.

#### 24 • ANDREW TONEY

Guard (1977-80)

#### UL's Second All-Time Leading Scorer Ranks in Top 50 All-Time in NCAA Scoring Two-Time Southland Player of the Year 1980 Associated Press All-America

Louisiana-Lafayette's most successful player in the profressional ranks, **Andrew Toney** helped make the Philadelphia 76ers a powerhouse in the 1980s, himself being one of the most feared players in the league at the time.

The 6-foot-3, Birmingham, Ala., native played four years in Cajunland and finished second only to Dwight "Bo" Lamar in career scoring.

He scored 2,526 points and averaged 23.6 points per game in his tenure with the Cajuns, scoring 46 points in a game three times. His best scoring season was his last when he averaged 26.1 points per game as he led the Cajuns into the quarterfinals of the NIT.

A consistent shooter, Toney hit 53 percent of this shots from the field in his career and ranked among the team leader in assists, field goals and free throw percentage.

Toney starred for the 76ers from 1980-89. He finished his nine-year NBA career with a 15.9 career scoring average and a shooting percentage of .500 from the field and .797 from the free throw line. His best season came during the 1982-83 campaign when he helped lead the 76ers to a league chapionship and an NBA playoff record for winning percentage (.923 with a 12-1 playoff record that year).



# Ragin' Cajuns Men's Basketball 2009–10



#### 1911-12

Louisiana, then known as Southwestern Louisiana Industrial Institute (SLII), fields its first boys basketball team. After dropping its first contest to Louisiana College, SLII wins its last four games to finish the campaign 4-1.

#### 1914-15

The 1914-15 season marks Louisiana's first season of intercollegiate basketball competition. It was SLII's first year as a member of the **Louisiana Intercollegiate Athletic Association (LIAA)**. The Bulldogs finish the season 5-6.

#### 1915-16 (pictured)

In its second season of intercollegiate competition, SLII goes 7-6 to post its first winning season in the college ranks.

#### 1922-23

The Cajuns post their first 20-win season, finishing with a 21-9 record. However, early records are scarce and UL's exact season competition is not complete at this time.

#### 1937-38

Beginning with the 1937-38 season, the NCAA confines basketball records to the "modern era," the first season without the center jump after each goal scored.

#### January 16, 1950

For the first time, the Cajuns need extra periods to defeat an opponent – thus marking UL's first overtime game. UL lost 69-67 in two overtimes at Louisiana Tech.

#### February 6, 1950

UL hosts Louisiana College in the first game played in Blackham Coliseum. LC gave the Cajuns a scare, but UL pulled out a nail-biter. 52-51.

#### December 14, 1956

The Cajuns break the 100-point mark for the first time in program history, as UL eased past Houma Air Station 108-57.

#### December 28, 1959

Louisiana hosts its first Bayou Classic at Blackham Coliseum. The Cajuns defeat Stetson 80-73.

#### February 20, 1960

The Cajuns post their second 20-win season, defeating Spring Hill 80-73.

#### <u>1960-61</u>

The Cajuns finish the season ranked in the top 10 nationally according to the final NAIA poll. UL posts an 18-5 mark during the season.

#### 1963-64

Louisiana claims the first Gulf States Conference basketball championship in school history, finishing the season with a 7-3 conference mark.

#### 1964-65

On the heels of its first GSC title, the Cajuns tally their third 20-win season (20-10) and win the NAIA District 27 Tournament championship. The Cajuns later participate in their first NAIA National Tournament.

#### 1965

**Dean Church** becomes the first player in school history to be selected in the NBA Draft. Church was chosen in the 10th round by the Philadelphia 76ers.

#### 1965-66

The Cajuns win the Gulf States Conference crown for the second time in three seasons.

#### March 15, 1967

The Cajuns record the first of three consecutive 20-win seasons as UL defeats Central Michigan for its 20th victory.

#### February 27, 1969

UL travels outside the continental United States for the first time, as the Cajuns play the Hawai'i Warriors twice.

#### 1970

**Marvin Winkler**, then the school's all-time leading scorer, becomes the first former UL player to play in the NBA, playing three games for the Milwaukee Bucks.

#### 1970-71

Beginning with the 1970-71 season, UL begins its first season of NCAA competition at the College level (ultimately Division II).

#### February 25, 1971

**Dwight "Bo" Lamar** scores a school-record 62 points against Louisiana-Monroe at Blackham Coliseum. He is the first player in school history to score 50 or more points in a game.

#### March 11, 1972

Louisiana defeats Marshall, 112-101, in the first round of the NCAA Midwest Region in Las Cruces, N.M. It marks UL's first NCAA Tournament win in the University Division.

#### <u>January 29, 1973</u>

**Dwight "Bo" Lamar** becomes the first player in school history to score 50 or more points in a game five times after scoring 50 against Houston Baptist.

#### 198

**Andrew Toney** becomes the first former UL player to be drafted in the first round of the NBA Draft. The Philadelphia 76ers pick Toney with the eighth pick overall.

#### March 3, 1981

The Cajuns win their first conference tournament game at the NCAA level, defeating Arkansas State 91-83 in the first round of the Southland Conference Tournament at Blackham Coliseum.

#### March 2, 1982

Louisiana wins its first conference tournament championship, claiming an 81-75 win over Texas-Arlington at Blackham Coliseum.

#### March 22, 1984

The Ragin' Cajuns advance to the Final Four of the National Invitation Tournament, following a 97-76 win over Santa Clara. UL would lose to Notre Dame, 65-59, in the semifinals of the NIT at Madison Square Garden.

#### November 22, 1985

The Cajuns open the brand-new Cajundome with their season opener against Georgia. However, the Bulldogs spoiled the facility's opener, defeating UL 78-75.

#### **December 2, 1985**

Third time's a charm - In their third game played at the new Cajundome, Louisiana defeats Missouri-St. Louis 77-60 for its first win at its new home.

#### 1991

With the 18th pick in the first round of the 1991 NBA Draft, the Milwaukee Bucks select UL's **Kevin Brooks**. Brooks becomes the second player in school history to be drafted in the first round of the NBA Draft.

#### March 8, 1992

After claiming the Sun Belt Conference regular season championship, **Marty Fletcher's** Ragin' Cajuns win the Sun Belt Tournament title, defeating Louisiana Tech 75-71 at the Mississippi Coast Coliseum in Biloxi.

#### March 8, 1994

Two years to the day of winning its first SBC Tournament crown, the Cajuns claim their second tournament title in three years, knocking off Western Kentucky 78-72 on the Hilltoppers' home court in Bowling Green.

#### March 7, 2000

Louisiana hoists its third Sun Belt Conference Tournament trophy, squeaking past South Alabama 51-50 in Little Rock, Ark.

#### 2001-02

The Cajuns clinch the first of two straight Sun Belt West Division crowns after posting a 20-11 overall mark and an 11-4 record against conference competition.

#### 2002-03

Louisiana-Lafayette finishes the season with its second straight 20-win season, clinching its second consecutive Sun Belt West Division title.

#### November 23, 2002

The Ragin' Cajuns buried 14 triples and surprised No. 12 Mississippi State 79-76 in the season opener in Starkville. Brad Boyd led the way with nine three-point makes. It was the first win over a ranked team since December 1992.

#### November 19, 2004

Louisiana's **Robert Lee** debuts as the 11th head coach in program history. Lee's Cajuns defeat Louisiana Tech 84-63 in Baton Rouge.

#### 2005-06

The Ragin' Cajuns returned to the site of many of the historical moments in program history when non-conference games were moved to Blackham Coliseum. The move was made necessary after the Cajundome was utilized as a shelter during Hurricanes Katrina and Rita and was closed for repairs November through December.

#### 2007-08


Louisiana held opponents to a 65.8 point-per-game average - the lowest in the program's Division I history

#### March 1, 2008

Louisiana defeats Denver 58-51 to lock up a share of the Sun Belt West Division crown. It's the first division championship under head coach Robert Lee and first for the program since 2002-03.

### DR. E. JOSEPH SAVOIE

University President | Louisiana, 1976

r. E. Joseph Savoie is the sixth president of the University of Louisiana at He holds bachelor's and master's degrees in education from UL Lafayette and earned a doctor of education in educational leadership and administration from Columbia University's Teachers College in New York.

As former Commissioner of Higher Education for the State of Louisiana, he was involved in several major postsecondary education reforms in Louisiana, including:

- the restructuring of higher education governance;
- creation of the Louisiana Community and Technical College System;
- · teacher education and school reform initiatives;
- the state's Master Plan for Public Postsecondary Education; and
- the promotion of collaboration within the entire education community.

Under his leadership, financial support for public postsecondary education more than doubled and Louisiana's colleges and universities became more engaged in addressing Louisiana's economic and social challenges.

Savoie held numerous state, regional, and national positions. Govs. M. J. "Mike" Foster, Edwin Edwards and Kathleen Blanco all tapped him for higher education committees and commissions in their administrations. Savoie was a cabinet member in three governors' administrations - Foster's, Blanco's and Bobby Jindal's.

His regional and national affiliations include the Southern Regional Education Board, the national State Higher Education Executive Officers, the Council for Advancement and Support of Education and the American Association of School Administrators.

His awards and honors include the 2007 CASE District IV Chief Executive Leadership Award. which was renamed the "Dr. E. Joseph Savoie Chief Executive Leadership Award;" the 2004 University of Louisiana at Lafayette Outstanding Alumnus Award; and the 2000 Henry Mason Award, which is presented by the Louisiana Chapter of the American Association of University Professors.

Savoie returned to his alma mater as president in July 2008. Prior to his appointment as Commissioner of Higher Education, he served in many roles on the UL Lafayette campus, including vice president for University Advancement, executive director of the Alumni Association, program director for Union Program Council, student government advisor and adjunct assistant professor.

Savoie and his wife, Gail, have a daughter, Jennifer Blaire Saulnier, and a son, Adam Savoie.

### DAVID WALKER

Director of Athletics | Louisiana, 1976

fter nearly two years at the helm as Interim Director Athletics post-Hurricane Katrina, **David Walker** was appointed to the position on a full-time basis on July 17, 2007. Walker, a graduate of the University in 1976, has served his alma mater in various administrative positions since 1978.

In 2005, as the Interim AD, Walker coordinated the post-Hurricane Katrina New Orleans Bowl which was played at UL's Cajun Field. He was also instrumental in the cultivation of Cox Communication's donation of \$2 million to the Louisiana Department of Athletics, the largest single gift to the program.

Walker, a Bunkie, La. native, graduated from Berwick High School. Following a four-year enlistment in the United States Air Force, Walker enrolled at the University of Southwestern Louisiana (now UL). Walker later obtained his Bachelor of Science degree in Business and his Master of Business Administration degree from the University.

He married the former Patricia Sutton of Berwick, La., in 1971 and they are the parents of one daughter, Ginny Rebecca.



#### SCOTT FARMER Senior Associate Athletics Director Georgia Southern, 1986

Scott Farmer has served in the Ragin' Cajuns athletic department as Senior Associate Director of Athletics since August 2007.

In his short time at UL, Farmer has played integral roles in establishing the Ragin' Cajuns Athletic Foundation

(RCAF) and laying the groundwork for various athletics facility improvements.

In 2008, football season ticket sales increased 56.1% as the Cajuns led the Sun Belt in attendance. In addition, the Cajuns have seen a significant increase in corporate sponships.

Farmer is a current member of the NCAA Division I Softball Committee and serves as Chairman of the Midwest Region Selection Committee.

He joined the UL athletics staff after spending eight-plus years at Sun Belt Conference member Troy University, where he served in a similar capacity.

Before serving as the Senior Associate AD at Troy, he served as the Interim Director of Athletics. While in that position, Farmer saw Troy's football program play in its first bowl game and the school begin the change from the Atlantic Sun Conference to the Sun Belt. While at Troy, he oversaw the internal workings of Troy's 17-sport program, while being directly responsible for the department's sports programs, the support staff and the business office.

His other responsibilities included working with all head coaches to coordinate scheduling; coordinating the development and monitoring of all sports budges; and assisting in the formulation, implementation and enforcement of departmental policies. He also coordinated the strategic planning process for the athletics department. while serving as the second-in-command for all athletics department affairs.

He arrived at Troy from Georgia Southern in February 1999, where he spent 12 years in a variety of roles, including the last year as Assistant AD for Student-Athlete Services. At GSU, he began his career as the women's swimming coach and later coached the men's program as well. His women's teams were 67-25 over nine seasons, while the men were 19-19 in three seasons.

He led his women's squads to eight consecutive Southern States Conference championships from 1989-1996 and the men to one in 1996. He won conference Coach of the Year honors five times, had six conference Swimmers of the Year and one Diver of the Year.

From 1988-1996, Farmer held the dual role of head swimming coach and Assistant AD for Sports Programs, Student-Athlete Services and Event Management.

Farmer earned his Bachelor of Science degree in health and physical education in 1986, while earning his master's degree in sport management in 1987 – both from Georgia Southern, He was the 1985 GSU Scholar-Athlete of the Year and set six school records while recording four letters on the

A native of Ormond Beach, Fla., he is married to the former Jackie Davis. The couple has a daughter, Kaitlin, and a son,



Sherry LeBas has been with the Louisiana athletics program since 1975 and has served as Senior Woman Administrator for more than three decades. In 1983, she assumed additional responsibilities as an

Assistant Athletics Director and was promoted to Associate Athletics Director in 2008.

For seven seasons, LeBas served as head coach of the Ragin' Cajuns volleyball team, while also serving as tennis coach during her career before stepping down from coaching duties in 1985 to devote her full attention to administrative

The Opelousas, La. native is in charge of the event management of the various athletics teams, as well as serving as the administrative advisor for the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). She also monitors the department's compliance with Title IX regulations.


Dugas was named as UL's event management coordinator and worked with the planning and staging of all Ragin' Cajuns athletics events.







### **LAGNIAPPE**

### LOUISIANA'S RECENT NOTEWORTHY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Louisiana's Mathematics Department is one of the Top 100 university math departments in the nation, according to the National Science Foundation. The University's Computer Science Department is among the top 60 university computer science departments.
- The National Incident Management Systems and Advanced Technologies Institute, which is using supercomputers and visualization technologies to try to improve disaster management by public and private sectors, was established in October 2007. NIMSAT's Business Emergency Operations Center will be housed in Abdalla Hall.
- UL is the only university in Louisiana that has a simulated neonatal, pediatric and labor delivery unit. Its Maternal/Child Life Skills laboratory is in Wharton Hall. There, senior nursing students in the College of Nursing and Allied Health Professions use sophisticated computerized simulators that can mimic real-world hospital situations.
- The **Ernest J. Gaines Center** in Dupré Library will house the only complete collection of Gaines' scholarship in the world. It will be built on the library's third floor. Gaines, author of "The Autobiography of Miss Jane Pittman" and "A Lesson Before Dying," is writer-in-residence emeritus. He was presented with an honorary doctorate from Louisiana in May 2008.
- A group of UL students participating in the Cajun Advanced Picosatellite Experiment (CAPE) built a small artificial satellite, known as a CubeSat, and sucessfully launched the State of Louisiana's first university student-bulit satellite into orbit from the Republic of Kazakhstan in 2007.
- The University of Louisiana is one of the most affordable universities in the nation, thanks to comprehensive scholarship and financial aid programs, including out-of-state fee waivers to qualified students.
- The University was among 20 teams chosen worldwide to compete in the U.S. Department of Energy's Solar Decathlon. The teams had to design, build and operate a small energy-efficient house that's powered entirely by the sun. UL's **Beausoleil Team** represents collaboration among the School of Architecture and Design, College of Engineering and the B.I. Moody III College of Business Administration.
- In March 2008, the University activated First Call, an interactive communications network that uses voice, e-mail and text to alert registered users to emergencies on campus.
- In 2004, students and faculty produced CajunBot, one of 25 autonomous vehicles that competed in the U.S. Department of Defense DARPA Grand Challenge. CajunBot, which was featured on CNN, uses artificial intelligence and GPS positioning to navigate a designated route while detecting and avoiding obstacles.

### **ACADEMICS**

- 100 percent of all undergraduate programs at UL that are eligible for accreditation by professional agencies are accredited.
- UL is a member of the Southeastern Universities Research Association, which is composed of members from more than a dozen southeastern states and the District of Columbia. Other members include Duke, Vanderbilt and Auburn universities.
- The Carnegie Foundation has designated Louisiana-Lafayette as a "Research University with High Research Activity." That puts UL in the same category as Clemson, Auburn and Baylor universities. The only other Louisiana institution in the same category is the University of New Orleans.
- The University of Louisiana is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.
- Louisiana offers 80 undergraduate degree programs.
- There are 29 master's degree programs and one post master's certificate program.
- Doctor of Philosophy degrees are offered in applied language and speech sciences, biology, cognitive science, English, Francophone studies, mathematics, computer science and computer engineering. A joint doctor of education degree is offered in educational leadership by Louisiana and Southeastern Louisiana University.
- $\blacksquare$  About 1,200 students are graduated each fall and spring.

### **IMPACT LOUISIANA**

- The University of Louisiana employs nearly 2,000 people and through spending, helps sustain more than 7,500 jobs in the Lafayette area.
- If it were a private business, the University would be the largest private businesses in Lafayette Parish.
- Louisiana's total spending impact exceeds \$750 million each year, with over \$725 million of that total spending impact felt in Acadiana.
- UL's economic development centers helped increase client revenue by over \$1 billion in the last year and created or retained nearly 23,000 jobs for businesses.
- If the University were a city, it would be the 17th largest in the State of Louisiana.
- The University of Louisiana pays more than \$65 million in salaries and wages each year.
- Students are responsible for over \$125 million in direct spending annually.
- The University injects about \$150 million of direct, unrestricted spending into the local economy per year.

**Player Availability** 

- MEDIA MEMBERS SHOULD NEVER CONTACT A STUDENT-ATHLETE DIRECTLY AT ANY TIME.
- · That contact rule begins the minute the S-A enrolls in school as a freshman until the time they run out of eligibility - offseason and summers included. Contact includes, but is not limited to, in-person interviews outside of an athletic event or practice, phone calls, text messages, email and any other form of online communication (ie. Facebook, MySpace, etc.).
- Student-athletes have been instructed to immediately terminate any contact initiated by a member of the media.
- · Player interviews MUST be arranged through the SID office. Players will not be available for gameday interviews until the postgame press conference. Interviews will always be scheduled around a student-athlete's academic schedule.

**Basketball Student-Athlete Availability** 

- Student-athletes are available for interviews AFTER **PRACTICE** depending on their class schedule.
- Student-athletes are **NOT** available for interviews if it is their NCAA mandated day off.
- NO INTERVIEWS the day BEFORE or day AFTER a
- Practice is closed to the media the day before and day after a game. **Gameday shootaround is CLOSED.**

- Practices are closed to the public due to limited space inside the Leon Moncla Indoor Practice

- · Media members are allowed inside the Leon Moncla Indoor Practice Facility for **ONLY** the **first** 15 minutes and final 30 minutes of practices that are open.

Injury Information

- Portability Health Insurance Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) regulates the use and disclosure of certain information held by "covered entities". It establishes regulations for the use and disclosure of Protected Health Information (PHI). PHI is any information held by a covered entity which concerns health status and provision of health care that can be linked to an individual. This is interpreted rather broadly and includes any part of an individual's medical record.
- HIPAA Privacy Rule. Under the HIPAA Privacy Rule, the University must reasonably limit uses and disclosures of medical information to the minimum necessary to accomplish their intended purpose. In order to supply the media with injury information related to student-athletes, the University shall be limited to discussing the athlete's name, along with a broad term for the injury and upcoming playing status.
- Student-athletes that miss practice due to an injury will not be available to the media for postpractice interviews.
- Student-athletes that are injured during a game will not be allowed to participate in post-game media interviews.
- Members of the media should never approach athletic trainers to discuss the injury of a student-athlete. All covering news outlets, including live television and radio broadcasts, will be supplied with in-game injury information by the SID.
- The SID office, in association with the athletic trainer, will have an injury report available to the media on Monday.

**Parking** 

• Cajundome: Media parking at the Cajundome is located on the north side of the arena (adjacent to Congress Street). Parking lot entrance number 8 must be used exclusively. Passes must be displayed in the front windshield at all times (you will not be allowed in the parking lot area without a parking pass).

### Media Services

- The Louisiana Sports Information staff provides the working news media with a media workroom with the sole purpose of writing and transmitting stories.
- · It is located on the ground level of the north quadrant of the Cajundome. Access to the press room is limited to those with working credentials ONLY.

### Traveling EAST/WEST on I-10

• From I-10, take Exit 100 (Ambassador Caffery) and come south (turning right if coming from the west, turning left and taking the overpass above I-10 if coming from the east). Travel south approximately three miles (note that the road will split along the way into Ambassador Caffery Parkway and Bertrand Drive...Stay to the left at the split and follow the sign that says "Bertrand Drive/Cajundome"). After passing though several traffic lights you will come to the intersection of Bertrand Drive and Congress Street. Take a left onto Congress Street. Go approximately 1/8 mile on Congress St. and turn right onto Cajundome Blvd.

### Traveling SOUTH on I-49

• From I-49, exit onto I-10 West (toward Lake Charles). **Then, follow the directions above from I-10.** 

#### **Traveling WEST/NORTHWEST on US 90**

• U.S. Highway 90 is known as Evangeline Thruway in Lafayette. Follow Evangeline Thwy. to the traffic light at the intersection of Evangeline Thwy. and University Avenue. Turn left onto University Ave. (turning right would take you toward the airport) and go approximately 2.5 miles to the traffic light at the intersection of University Ave. and Congress Street. Turn left onto Congress St. proceeding just over a mile. The Cajundome will be on the left directly following the intersection of Congress St. and Cajundome Boulevard.

### From Lafayette Airport

• Go left out of the immediate airport area (you will be on Surrey Street). Continue straight at the first traffic light, crossing Evangeline Thruway (note that you are now on University Avenue). Continue straight on University Ave. approximately 2.5 miles to the traffic light at the intersection of University Ave. and Congress Street. Turn left onto Congress St. proceeding just over a mile. The Cajundome will be on the left directly following the intersection of Congress St. and Cajundome Boulevard.
