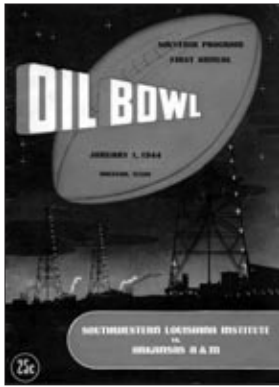

OIL BOWL

January 1, 1944
Robertson Stadium
Houston, TX

What many consider to be "The Best Team in Louisiana History", then S.L.I. defeated Arkansas A&M 24-7 to claim the Oil Bowl Championship.

The New Year's Day rematch was played under the same rainy, muddy and foggy conditions as the earlier meeting between the two teams on Nov. 6 in Memphis, Tenn. That game ended in a 20-20 tie.

The Cajuns versatile backs and strong offensive line was no match for the Aggies.

"I say that no team, and I put the emphasis on Notre Dame, could have beaten us that day," said UL Lafayette head coach Louis Whitman.

Louisiana-Lafayette was led by quarterback Alvin Dark, who either scored or set-up each of the Cajuns tallies.

The Cajuns struck in the first quarter when Dark returned an Aggies punt 24 yards down to the AAM 21 yard-line. Following an offside penalty and a first down run Dark, Dark split the uprights from 16 yards to give the Cajuns a 3-0 lead.

UL Lafayette upped their lead to 10-0 just two possessions later. Moe Richmond made a sensational leaping catch between two defenders for a 12-yard score from Dark.

Arkansas A&M moved down to the Cajuns 19 on the next possession, but came away empty handed. AAM's quarterback needed just two completions to move the Aggies 51 yards, but then threw three consecutive incompletions to turn the ball back over to UL Lafayette.

The Aggies scored on their first possession of the second half to cut the Cajuns lead to 10-7. A running into the kicker penalty on the Cajuns helped extend the AAM 64-yard drive that ended in a 27 yard touchdown pass from Gray to Bill Coomer.

Dark pinned the Aggies deep in their own territory with a 48-yard punt and then returned the ensuing AAM kick 15-yards to Cajuns 33 yard-line. Back-to-back first down runs by Bob Pillow and Dark set-up a seven-yard touchdown plunge by Pillow to give the Cajuns back their 10-point cushion.

Another excellent punt by Dark led to a short field for the Cajuns offense and another touchdown. Runs by Dark and Vincent Buckley set-up a 10-yard touchdown run by Dark to complete the scoring.

The Ragin' Cajuns, appearing in their second bowl in school history, fell victim to turnovers and special teams miscues en route to a 26-25 loss to the Tennessee State University Tigers.

Tennessee State scored two touchdowns in 1:28 to take a 14-0 lead after one quarter.

UL Lafayette responded with two touchdowns in the second quarter. Nelson Schexnayder hauled in a seven-yard touchdown pass from George Coussan, but Roy Pendergraft's extra point was blocked. Robert Gill scored on a four yard run just 3:46 later, but Coussan's pass to Dickie Haik was broken-up, and the Cajuns trailed 14-12 at the half.

A scoreless third quarter led to a frenzy of activity in the fourth stanza. Schexnayder caught his second touchdown of the game on a 17-yard toss from Coussan with 8:57 remaining in the game. Pendergraft's extra point gave the Cajuns a 19-14 lead.

The ensuing kickoff was fumbled by J. Thaxton into the end zone where Mike Courville recovered for a Cajuns touchdown. Pendergraft's extra point was blocked again, giving UL Lafayette a 25-14 lead.

TSU traveled 55 yards on seven plays in 2:45 culminating in a three-yard touchdown scramble by Joe Gilliam. Albert Davis was cut down on the try for two, keeping the score 25-20 in favor of the Cajuns.

Coussan's seventh interception of the game led to a short touchdown run by Davis with 3:22 remaining in the game.

The Cajuns comeback hopes were dashed when Tom Hauser's pass was intercepted by Donald Pinson, his fifth pick of the game, TSU's eighth.

CAJUN FIELD - "The Swamp"

Cajun Field enters its 36th season as the home of Louisiana's Ragin' Cajuns football.

For the past four seasons, all under head coach Rickey Bustle, the Cajuns have posted a winning record at home.

In addition, attendance for the last four seasons has increased 41 percent over the preceding four-year period.

From 2003-04, UL Lafayette won six straight home games, the fourth longest streak at Cajun Field.

UL Lafayette currently holds an all-time mark of 101-83-2 at Cajun Field.

Louisiana-Lafayette has enjoyed plenty of memorable moments since the venue opened in 1971.

The greatest of those moments came during the 1996 season when the Ragin' Cajuns opened their 26th season in the facility with the biggest upset in school history, a 29-22 victory over No. 25 Texas A&M in front of a Cajun Field-record 38,783 fans. It is also the largest crowd to ever attend an athletic event in Acadiana.

That mark surpassed the previous record crowd of 36,133 that saw the Cajuns face the Alabama Crimson Tide on Oct. 6, 1990.

"The Swamp" has been the site of much success with four consecutive 4-1 records from 1993-96. The school record for wins at Cajun Field in a season is seven, set during the 1976 season, one of two undefeated seasons at "The Swamp."

Cajun Field boasts 2,577 chairback seats and bleacher seating to the capacity of another 28,423, giving "The Swamp" a seating capacity of 31,000.

Cajun Field was built in time for the 1971 football season. The characteristics

which helped create the name and tradition have been there since the initial construction.

For the first 17 years, Louisiana's football stadium was simply known as Cajun Field. In the summer of 1988, then-Strength & Conditioning Coach Mickey Faulkinberry suggested referring to Cajun Field as "The Swamp".

The name stuck for various reasons. To start, the field surface is set two feet below sea level in a natural bowl. In addition to providing a picturesque surrounding, the sunken facility allows most fans to walk down to their stadium seats as a convenience. The Cajuns and their opponents must enter Cajun Field through a long tunnel from the UL Lafayette Athletics Complex.

With the below-sea level playing surface, a total of four 60-horsepower pumps and a sophisticated drainage system help keep the field in solid playing condition even during frequent South Louisiana rainstorms.

"The Swamp" nickname also fits in with the geographic makeup of the area, with its many surrounding bayous and wetlands, as well as the close proximity to the Gulf of Mexico, which lies just 30 miles south.

In fact, a popular gathering place for Louisiana-Lafayette students and a regular stop for visitors is the small swamp located in the heart of UL's main campus, which sits adjacent to the Student Union.

Ironically, the on-campus swamp, officially named Cypress Lake, lays over the original football field that existed during the early 1900's, adding to the distinct nickname.

The National Wetlands Center, a nationally renowned research facility that UL Lafayette hosts and administers, is located less than a half-mile from Cajun Field.

CHRISTIAN "KEENER" CAGLE

QB/K, Louisiana-Lafayette (1922-25)

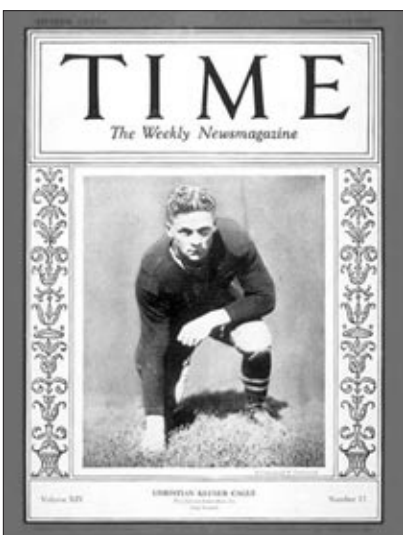
Born – May 1, 1905, DeRidder, LA
Died – Dec. 26, 1942, Manhattan, NY

Christian "Keener" Cagle played as a quarterback with exceptional halfback skills for Louisiana-Lafayette (then-Southwestern Louisiana Institute)

from 1922-1925. He went on to play for Army at West Point, N.Y., and the National Football League.

Cagle was known by many as "Red" or "Red Flash", but sportswriters preferred "Onward Christian" because of his ability to advance the ball.

During his senior season at UL Lafayette, Cagle was very productive. Cagle scored 93 points which stood as a school record until 1989. Also that season, Cagle split duty at quarterback. Records and historical documents indicate that Cagle rushed for 1,048 yards and passed for 944 yards, but these statistics have not been able to be confirmed.



Cagle appeared on the cover of Time Magazine the week of Sept. 23, 1929.

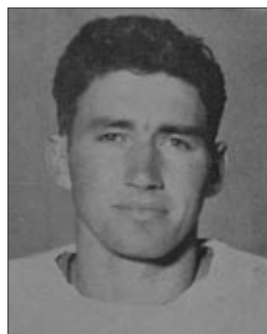
After playing at Louisiana-Lafayette for five seasons, Cagle became a three-time All-American halfback at Army from 1927 to 1929. He was considered one of the best run-pass-kick combination players in the game. In 1929, Cagle won the Helms Hall Award, the precursor to the Heisman Trophy. He resigned from the U.S. Military Academy after the 1929 season.

Cagle played for the New York Giants in the National Football League from 1930-1932.

In 1933, Cagle and John "Shipwreck" Kelly bought the NFL's Brooklyn Dodgers franchise for \$25,000. Cagle also played for the Dodgers in 1933 and 1934.

On December 23, 1942, Cagle was found unconscious in a Manhattan subway station. He died three days later of a fractured skull.

He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame posthumously in 1954.



ALVIN DARK

QB/TB, Louisiana-Lafayette (1943)

Born – Jan. 7, 1922, Comanche, OK

Alvin Dark, known to many Ragin' Cajun fans as "The Swamp Fox", was a member of Louisiana-Lafayette's greatest team in school history - 1943 Oil

Bowl Championship team.

That season, Southwestern Louisiana Industrial Institute finished the regular season with a 4-0-1 record. In the inaugural Oil Bowl in Houston, UL Lafayette exacted revenge on Arkansas A&M with a 24-7 victory. Earlier in the season, Arkansas A&M handed the Cajuns the only blemish on their record - a tie.

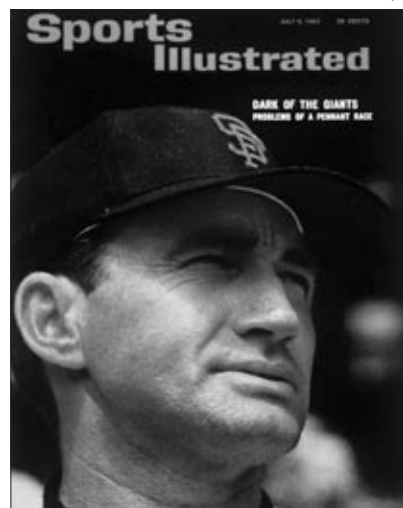
During the Oil Bowl, Dark scored half of the Cajuns' 24 points. He passed for a touchdown, rushed for a touchdown, kicked all three extra points and kicked a field goal.

While at Louisiana-Lafayette, Dark lettered in football, basketball, track, golf and baseball. It was baseball where Dark became a national star.

In 1948, Dark was named Major League Rookie of the Year. Dark and former Brooklyn Dodgers great Jackie Robinson are the only two players in Major League history to be named Rookie of the Year of both the American and National Leagues.

Dark would go on to play 14 seasons in the Major Leagues for six different clubs, including the Boston Braves, New York Giants, St. Louis Cardinals, Chicago Cubs, Philadelphia Phillies and the Milwaukee Braves.

In 1961, he became the manager of the San Francisco Giants. In only his second season, he led the Giants to the NL pennant and a spot in the World Series. It wasn't until 1974 when Dark finally won a world championship, leading the Oakland Athletics to the crown.

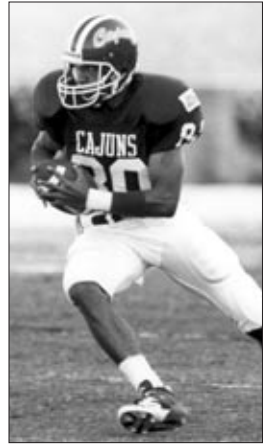

FOOTBALL HISTORY

Louisiana-Lafayette will compete in their sixth season of Sun Belt Conference football in 2006.

The winner of the Sun Belt Conference earns a berth in the New Orleans Bowl at the Louisiana Superdome on December 22 to be televised live nationally on ESPN2 at 7 p.m.

The Ragin' Cajuns compete with full-time Sun Belt members Arkansas State, Florida Atlantic, Florida International, Louisiana-Monroe, Middle Tennessee, North Texas and Troy. Other non-football members of the Sun Belt include: Arkansas-Little Rock, Denver, New Orleans, South Alabama and Western Kentucky.

From 1993-95, the Cajuns played in the Big West Conference. During that time, UL collected back-to-back championships in 1993 and 1994.

UL had its first official conference membership when it joined other state schools as well as schools from Mississippi and Alabama in the Gulf States Athletic Conference for the 1948-49 athletic season.

That league went through several changes in membership and eventually became an all-Louisiana league, but the Cajuns remained a member until the 1970-71 season, making it the school's longest affiliation with any conference.

Louisiana-Lafayette joined the Southland Conference in June 1971. The Southland, which had been founded during the 1960s, was comprised of schools from Louisiana, Texas and Arkansas. It was during that stint, that the Cajuns' athletic program moved from the college division to the university division of the NCAA.

Louisiana-Lafayette remained a member of the Southland Conference until 1982. In that year, the Southland Conference was reclassified into Division I-AA, at which time the Cajuns left the league to retain its Division I-A status in football.

Louisiana-Lafayette has never been a member of the NCAA's Division I-AA.

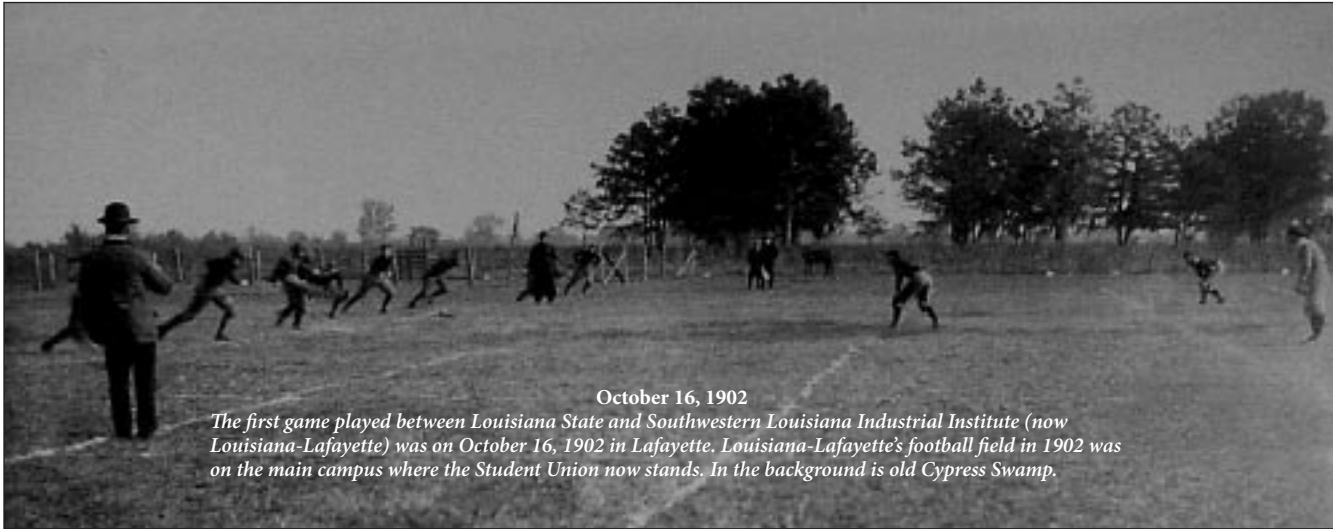
