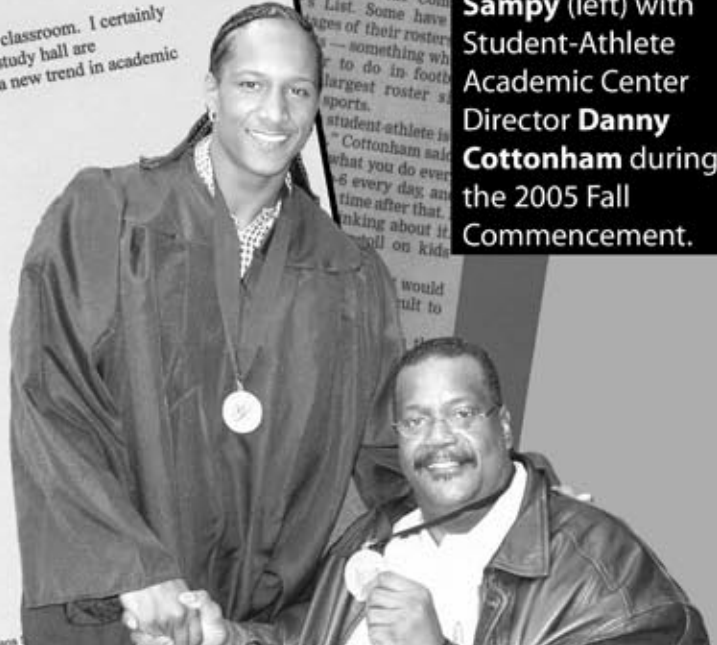
Dear Ricky:

Ragin' Cajuns Football: 2006 Preview

Louisiana's Ragin' Cajuns had lofty expectations heading into the 2005 season, but those hopes were dashed by a 1-5 start. The team hit rock bottom during its fifth loss, blowing a 15-point lead after three quarters and then allowing Arkansas State to gain 44 yards on five plays in 44 seconds before kicking a game-winning field goal as time expired.

Then things turned around.

UL stormed back beginning with a come-from-behind victory at Middle Tennessee. An overtime win over Troy on homecoming followed, before another comeback road win, as the Cajuns defeated North Texas. UL closed its home campaign with a win over FIU to set-up a first-place showdown in the season finale at Louisiana-Monroe.

With a conference title on the line, the Cajuns dismantled the Indians by a final score of 54-21 to claim a share of the Sun Belt championship.

Louisiana's five game winning streak put the Cajuns into a three-way tie atop the 'Belt at 5-2 with ASU and ULM. The New Orleans Bowl berth came down to a tiebreaker that went in favor of ASU. ULM was taken out of the tiebreaker because they were not bowl eligible and the Cajuns disappointing loss at ASU earlier in the season became the difference.

With a seventh conference championship, expectations for the Cajuns in 2006 have increased even further. Forty letterwinners return, including 16 starters. The Cajuns lost just 13 seniors, all of which were on the two-deep for the season finale.

UL brings the fifth longest winning streak in the nation into 2006 with eyes on the New Orleans Bowl.

Offense

The Cajuns slow start to last season can't be blamed on how successful the offense started games. Louisiana took their opening drive into the end zone six times and led after three quarters in eight games.

The Cajuns led the Sun Belt in nine different offensive categories; scoring offense (26.0ppg), rushing offense (254.3yppg), rushing touchdowns (34), total offense (386.6yppg), offensive touchdowns (37), first downs (227), third-down conversion percentage (44.8%), fourth-down conversion percentage (64.3%), and time of possession (31:32).

It marked the second straight season that UL led the 'Belt in total offense.

The Cajuns dominated teams on the ground, rushing for a school record 2,797 yards and 34 touchdowns. UL's 254.3 rushing yards per game ranked seventh in the nation and was the best average in school history. The Cajuns old mark of 206.5 rushing yards per game was set in 1983. UL's 34 rushing touchdowns was the sixth most in the country.

In addition, the Cajuns fired at 90.6 percent (29-32) in the red zone during conference play, giving the team an 88.1 percent (75-84) red zone success rate in conference play over the last three seasons.

The offensive line was a major factor in the team's run dominance last season and returns three starters. The unit allowed 23 sacks in 2004 and reduced that number to just nine sacks allowed in 2005 - the fourth fewest in the nation.

Six-foot-six senior right tackle **Brandon Cox** was asked for an all-conference effort in 2005 and delivered by being named first team All-Sun Belt. Junior left tackle **Jesse Newman** was also on the All-Sun Belt squad. **Will Chance** and **Tim Falter** shared time at guard last season, but both will be asked to start in 2006. JC transfer **Junior Ramos** slides into center, a position left open by departed senior leader Greg Hodges.

Experienced back-ups will again be an issue on the offensive front. Just four of the team's 15 reserves, **Zach Leger** (51 snaps), **Lanier Coleman** (37 snaps), **Ryan Gilles** (35 snaps) and **Tremaine Lewis** (19 snaps), have seen time on the field.

The most inexperienced position with the largest amount of raw talent is wide receiver. The Cajuns lost 55 of their 108 receptions by a wide out in 2005.

Five receivers return with a reception, led by sophomore **Derrick Smith** (22-250, 2TD). Senior **Corey Fredrick** (21-293) didn't participate in spring drills to focus on his academics. **Jason Chery** had seven catches in his freshman season after converting from a running back in high school. Six-foot-six junior **Jordan Jackson** had only one reception last season, while junior **Ray Givens** had just two receptions a year ago. Both must step-up their efforts in order to see more time on the field.

Four redshirts and four incoming freshmen will compete for spots on the two-deep in the fall. Redshirt **Phillip Nevels** had a fantastic spring, including a 79-yard TD reception in the spring game, and holds an edge over the newcomers entering fall drills.

The Cajuns deepest group lies under center. Senior starter **Jerry Babb** and 2005 Sun Belt All-Purpose Player of the Year **Michael Desormeaux** form the best 1-2 quarterback combo in the SBC.

Babb sits in third place in school history in career offensive plays and offensive yards, fourth in career pass attempts and pass yards and third in career completions. He is the most accurate passer in school history, connecting at 58.1 percent (443-763), with an average 10.4 yards per completion. Babb is equally as

dangerous with his legs. He has 1,130 career rushing yards on 234 carries, including three 100-yard rushing games. Babb has 34 career touchdowns – 21 passing and 13 rushing. Following his return from injury last season, Babb finished 22-of-31 passing (71%) and ran 40-for-266 (6.7ypc) with 3 touchdowns.

Babb's injury gave Desormeaux four starts at QB in 2005. On the season, Desormeaux completed 53 percent of his passes for 597 yards and added 487 yards rushing and three touchdowns. When he was not starting at quarterback, Desormeaux was a valuable special teams player.

Redshirts **John Hundley** and **Connor Morel** are excellent young arms that took most of the spring reps. Both will be in the mix if Babb or Desormeaux is injured.

What To Look For From the Cajuns Offense

Up Front: Encore. The O-line paved the way in 2005 for a school-record 2,797 rushing yards and allowed only nine sacks. Three starters return.

Under Center: Intelligence. Quarterbacks Jerry Babb and Michael Desormeaux make the Cajuns no-huddle and option offense click.

On the Outside: Plays. The receivers were not spectacular last year, but they didn't have to be. When the offense faces passing situations, who will make the plays?

At Tight End: Toughness. The tight ends have to be physically tough in the running game and mentally tough in spot passing situations when their number is called.

In the backfield: Yards. 1,000-yard back Tyrell Fenroy returns along with Josh Harrison, Caleb Rubin, Chester Johnson, Abdule Levier and Chancellor Roberson. Add speedy redshirt Deon Wallace and this is a dangerous backfield.

The Cajuns brightest young star exploded onto the scene in the form of running back **Tyrell Fenroy**. Fenroy posted five of the top 10 modern era rushing performances by a Cajuns true freshman in school history en route to becoming the first Cajuns running back to ever gain 1,000 yards in a season. He is the only true freshman in school history to post at least two 100-yard rushing performances and it was his play down the stretch that spearheaded the Cajuns winning streak.

Fenroy had 96 carries for 569 yards and 10 touchdowns over his last four games – all 100+ yard performances. He tied the school record for consecutive 100-yard games (4) and his five 100-yard games are the most by a Cajuns running back in a single season.

In the Cajuns six victories, Fenroy had 785 yards on 124 carries (6.3 average per carry, 130.8 average per game).

DID YOU KNEAUX?

The Cajuns' Rank Third In the Nation

Entering the 2006 season, *Louisiana-Lafayette returns the third most rushing yards from the 2005 campaign, as well as the third most rushing touchdowns in the nation.*

The Cajuns bring back 2,566 rushing yards and 31 rushing scores, losing only 113 yards from senior fullback Dwight Lindon and 112 yards and three touchdowns from senior fullback Booker Jenkins.

Every other player who contributed to the running game in 2005 returns for the 2006 season.

Louisville returns 41 rushing touchdowns, while national champion Texas returns 40 grounds scores.

West Virginia and California boast 3,050 and 2,686 rushing yards, respectively.

UL averaged 289.2 rushing yards in victory on an average of 5.4 yards per attempt. Meanwhile, the Cajuns averaged 212 rushing yard in losses on an average of 5.1 yards per attempt.

Although Fenroy's numbers are impressive, it certainly wasn't a one-man show in the backfield. Five other backs received significant carries last year, equaling exactly 179 totes – the same number of carries Fenroy had. That group ran for 787 yards and 12 touchdowns.

Senior **Josh Harrison** (64-265, 4TD), junior **Abdule Levier** (46-213, 5TD) and sophomore **Caleb Rubin** (21-84) all return to provide depth. Former starter and fifth-year senior **Chester Johnson** received a medical hardship for 2005 after appearing in four plays in the season opener at Texas before sustaining a season-ending shoulder injury. Redshirt **Deon Wallace** has shown flashes on the practice field and will press for a spot in the lineup.

The Cajuns lost both fullbacks who saw the majority of the field last season. Sophomore **Chancellor Roberson** played sparingly in his first season, but is the only player on the roster with game experience at fullback. Expect Johnson and Levier to line-up at fullback quite often. Signee **Matt Desormeaux**, brother of Cajuns QB Michael Desormeaux, will compete for playing time in his first season.

What To Look For From the Cajuns Defense

Up Front: Havoc. The Cajuns led the conference in sacks during league play. A large healthy rotation should supply pressure on all downs. All-Sun Belt end Tony Hills leads the group and should take heat off end Rodney Hardeway.

At Linebacker: Health. This group is talented, athletic, intelligent and consistent, but every member has suffered an injury or two over the last couple of seasons. A healthy group could dominate.

In Coverage: Experience. Corners Michael Adams, Jarrett Jones, Torres Kingsby, Jemarcus Smith and Kyle Ward have 11 letters between them. Like fine wine, this group gets better with age.

Playing Safety: Cohesiveness. Solid, yet not overpowering, this group needs to mold together and provide a solid backbone to the Cajuns run and pass defense.

Defense

The Cajuns defense allowed a total of 210 points (35/gm) in the first six games of 2005, but then clamped down over the final five games, holding opponents to 94 points (18.8/gm). That turnaround can be attributed to getting to the quarterback. UL totaled 14 sacks over the final five games, compared to seven sacks in the first six games. Louisiana led the conference with 18 sacks in league play. The Cajuns had only nine total sacks in 2004.

After struggling to stop the run in conference play in 2004 (198.3/gm, 5.0/carry, 14TD), the Cajuns improved from last in the 'Belt to third in 2005 (148.4/gm, 4.1/carry, 11TD). The team ranked second in SBC play in total defense.

The defensive front lost just three players, returns five letterwinners and welcomes six newcomers. Defensive end Eugene Kwarteng had his most productive year as a senior with 43 tackles, 7 tackles-for-loss and four sacks. **Rodney Hardeway** has the inside track on replacing Kwarteng. As a sophomore, Hardeway posted 18 tackles, 4.5 TFLs and three sacks. **Tony Hills** will fill the other end spot. An All-Sun Belt selection last season, Hills recorded 19 tackles, 4.5 TFLs and four sacks.

Senior DE looks for second All-Sun Belt season

Senior defensive tackles **Marshall Delesdernier**, **Travis Ferguson** and **Joe Bradley** have eight letters of experience between the three and should provide an excellent framework to help initiate the younger linemen.

JC transfers **Korey Raymond** and **Lamarr Waiters** enjoyed the benefit of spring ball and will have an edge over newcomers **Greg Hathorn**, **Chris Johnson**, **Blake Ramsey** and **Colin Windsor**.

The Cajuns received the most production from its linebackers last season and that trend should continue. Starters **Mark Risher** and **Brent Burkhalter** are the team's top two returning tacklers. Risher started all 11 games a year ago and finished second with 59 total tackles and five tackles for loss. His consistency was terrific, as he made at least four tackles in nine games. Burkhalter played in all 11 games as a redshirt freshman, starting three of the last four. He was third on the team with 53 tackles and 4.5 tackles-for-loss. Burkhalter is the first freshman to record 50+ tackles since Charles Tillman posted 82 tackles as a true freshman in 1999. Burkhalter had at least three tackles in each of the first 10 games before failing to record a tackle in season finale after leaving the game with a wrist injury. That wrist injury limited the sophomore early in spring ball, but he should be ready for fall drills.

Senior **Tre' Green** started a pair of games last season. He looks to return to a starters role with the departure of leading tackler Tyler Norman. Green started all 11 games in 2004, but finds plenty of competition for a starting spot in 2006.

Wes Simon started the first three games in 2005, but missed most of the season recovering from a concussion. Simon was cleared for the spring and should be fine in the fall. Seniors **Mack Fair**

and **Derek Morel**, along with sophomores **Jonathon Vance** and **Joseph Hadnot** all figure to be in the mix battling for starting positions. Hadnot is the sleeper among the group. A redshirt in 2004, Hadnot missed all of 2005 and spring of 2006 with an ankle injury.

The Cajuns secondary has lost six players to the NFL in the last five years, yet continues to improve. UL allowed more passing yards in 2005 than previous seasons, but that was a result of the Cajuns leading games and forcing their opponents to put the ball in the air.

All five corners on the two-deep from last season return. Senior **Michael Adams** and junior **Kyle Ward** figure to have the edge on starting positions. Adams, an All-Sun Belt member last year, plays bigger than his 5-foot-8, 170-pound frame, and is a valuable special teams player (five career blocked kicks). Ward, a standout track athlete, started five of the last six games in 2005 after sitting a season following his transfer from a one-year stint at Alcorn State in 2003-04.

Senior nickel back **Jarrett Jones** and juniors **Torres Kingsby** and **Jemarcus Smith** saw significant time on the field last year and should be active corners.

Johnny Felders and **Lamar Morgan** shared time at strong safety last season, but Morgan moves to free safety and looks to take over for departed senior Terry Fenton. Felders started seven games in 2005, while Morgan garnered five starts.

Derik Keyes lettered in the secondary last season and will fight for a spot on the two-deep alongside redshirts **Gerren Blount** and **Phillip Walker**.

Newcomers **Daylon McCoy** and **Maurice Rolle** will join the team in the fall and compete for playing time.

Special Teams

Special teams is always a focal point under Coach Bustle, especially the field goal, punt and PAT block teams. UL has blocked 23 kicks over the past four seasons (2002 - 7, 2003 - 5, 2004 - 4, 2005 - 7). Under Coach Bustle, the Cajuns have never gone more than five games without blocking a kick. Five of UL's 23 blocks have directly resulted in points (30 total), including three blocked field goal returns.

The team had a role reversal in its return game from 2004 to 2005. Louisiana went from last (6.3) in the SBC in punt return average to second (11.6), while the kickoff return average fell from third (21.0) to seventh (16.9).

The weakest of the Cajuns special teams units in 2005 was the kickoff and punt coverage teams. The Cajuns ranked 95th in the NCAA in punt return defense, allowing an average of 12.1 yards per punt return. The team allowed just 6.5 yards per punt return in 2004. UL placed 93rd in kickoff return defense, allowing an average of 22.7 yards per kickoff return. The Cajuns kickoff return defense was actually an improvement from 2004, when the team allowed 27.1 yards per kickoff return.

The biggest loss on special teams is kicker Sean Comiskey. Comiskey has been the only player to attempt a field goal or extra point under coach Bustle. Originally a walk-on, Comiskey finished his four-year career as the school's all-time leading scorer among kickers. He holds the career record for extra points and came within three field goals of that career mark. Sophomore kicker **Drew Edmiston** and senior punter **Brit Framel** competed for the job in the spring and will face a third competitor in the fall with signee **Tyler Albrecht**.

Framel is the incumbent starting punter and will likely be backed by Albrecht. The Cajuns punting improved one spot from last in the Sun Belt in 2004 to seventh in 2005, but still ranked 111th in the NCAA with a 31.7 punting average.

Justin Venable's eight seasons of eligibility are over and, after snapping every ball for the past three years, UL needs to find a new deep snapper. Redshirt freshman **Scott Hayes** was tutored last season by Venable and will get the opportunity to be the Cajuns new snapper.

Intangibles

The Cajuns lost two games on last second field goals.

The team set a new single-game school record with nine sacks in a comeback win at Middle Tennessee.

UL trailed heading into the fourth quarter only three times all season (39-3 at #2 Texas, 24-3 at Eastern Michigan and 10-7 at Middle Tennessee).

The Cajuns finished 3-2 at Cajun Field, marking the fourth straight season that the

team was .500 or better at home. Bustle and the Cajuns are 12-9 at home in those four seasons.

The Cajuns won eight Sun Belt Player of the Week awards, the most by the Cajuns since SBC play started in 2001. Eight players were named to the All-Sun Belt team, the most all-conference players the Cajuns have had since 11 Cajuns were named to the 1995 All-Big West team.

The Cajuns had 14 drives of 80+ yards.

Surprisingly, UL was +0 in turnover ratio during its season-ending five-game winning streak.

The Cajuns scoring in Sun Belt games has been very volatile under Coach Bustle. UL went from last in scoring offense in Sun Belt games in 2002 (19.5 points per game, 15 TD), to second in 2003 (32.1 ppg, 28 TD). The Cajuns regressed to seventh in 2004 (20.7 ppg, 17 TD), but improved to first in 2005 (29.0 ppg, 27 TD).

The Cajuns committed 72 penalties, the second fewest (by one penalty) in the Sun Belt. Coach Bustle's Cajuns have averaged just 71.5 penalties per year, leading the conference in fewest penalties two times and finishing second twice.

Schedule

Louisiana's Ragin' Cajuns will play a 12-game slate thanks to new NCAA regulations that added an additional game to college football's regular season.

The Cajuns played a 12-game regular season in 1977, 2002 and 2003.

The '06 season features six home and six road contests. UL will start the season with two road games on Sept. 2 at Louisiana State and Sept. 9 at Texas A&M.

The sixth annual Herbert Heymann Football Classic, which marks the first game played at Cajun Field each season, will feature North Carolina A&T on Sept. 23. Ohio University was originally scheduled, but negotiated a buy-out of their contract in favor of visiting Rutgers. UL then meets Eastern Michigan on Sept. 30. The Eagles are making their return visit to Lafayette after the Cajuns visited Ypsilanti this past season.

The Cajuns play at Houston Oct. 7, before 10 days of preparation for their SBC opener at Florida Atlantic on Wednesday, Oct. 18. The game will be nationally televised on ESPN2.

Middle Tennessee travels to Lafayette on Oct. 28 to serve as the Cajuns 61st homecoming opponent. After a Nov. 4 game at Troy, the Cajuns return home for a Nov. 11 contest versus North Texas. Louisiana's second trip to Florida comes with a Nov. 18 game at Florida International.

The Cajuns 2006 regular season comes to an end with consecutive home games at Cajun Field on Nov. 25 and Dec. 2 against Arkansas State and Louisiana-Monroe, respectively.

UL Lafayette's 2006 opponents were a combined 57-76 in 2005. The Cajuns are 58-80-1 all-time versus their 2006 competition.
