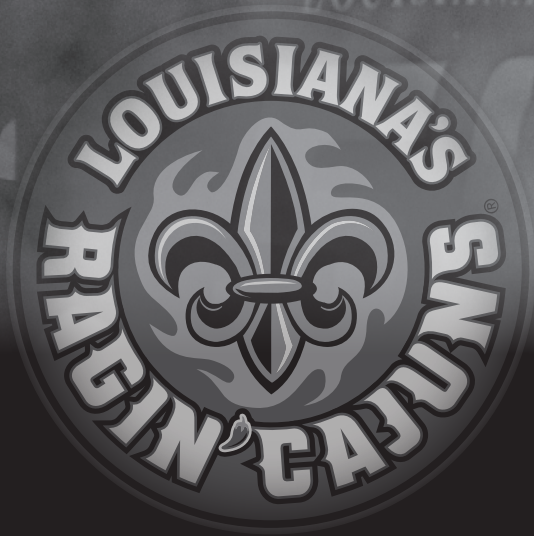

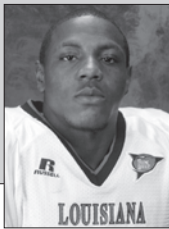
Ragin' Cajuns in the Pro Bowl

Carolina's Jake Delhomme was the last Ragin' Cajun to play in the Pro Bowl, playing for the NFC in 2006. Clarence Verdin is the only Ragin' Cajun to be a two-time Pro Bowl selection.

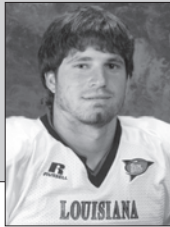
Ragin' Cajuns in the Super Bowl

Trahan Achievement Award at the Cajuns post-season banquet given to an individual who has an outstanding accomplishment thru the help of his teammates...Played in all 12 games on special teams and also saw time at quarterback, wide receiver and defensive back...Had a season-high 45 snaps at FIU, playing on offense, defense and special teams...Attempted passes in three games, rushes in eight games and caught a pass in two games...Scored lone touchdown of the season with an eight-yard run at Texas A&M...Executed a fake punt with a 51-yard run from the Cajuns 44-yard line at Houston...Recovered an Eastern Michigan onsides kick on the hands team...Made four tackles on the season...Recovered three fumbles - all on special teams - two at eighth-ranked LSU and one at Troy, tying for tops in the Sun Belt...Had two receptions for 18 yards vs. North Texas and four catches for 34 yards vs. Arkansas State...Named Cajuns Special Teams Player of the Week for efforts at LSU and Cajuns Offensive Player of the Week for performance at Texas A&M.

2005: Played in nine games, starting a four game stretch at quarterback that included games vs. Florida Atlantic, at Arkansas State, at Middle Tennessee and vs. Troy...Went 2-2 as a starter...Recipient of the Champion Award at the Cajuns post-season banquet as the top offensive newcomer...One of only three freshmen named to the All-Sun Belt team...Member of the Cajuns punt team for the first three games of the season...Second on the team with 487 rushing yards, adding three rushing touchdowns...Recorded the 14th best rushing performance in Cajuns history with 174 yards on 14 carries at Arkansas State...First collegiate pass went through the hands of receiver and was intercepted at second-ranked Texas...Threw five interceptions in first 58 career attempts, before finishing season with 59 straight attempts without a pick...Threw for a season-high 138 yards at Middle Tennessee, leading an 11-play, 71-yard drive to win the game with 1:04 remaining...Ran for 351 yards on 48 carries (7.3ypc) and a pair of scores in four games at starting QB...Named Hooter's/Credeur's Cajuns Offensive Player of the Week at Arkansas State and vs. FIU.

Ragin' Cajuns quarterback Michael Desormeaux didn't spend the 2006 season on the sidelines. Last season, in addition to taking snaps under center, Desormeaux lined up at wide receiver, played defensive back in dime situations, served as the personal protector on punts, been on the punt block team and recovered an onsides kick on the hands team. At the end of the season, only 10 players in the country had seen time on offense, defense and special teams. Desormeaux is the only player to play more than two positions and on special teams.

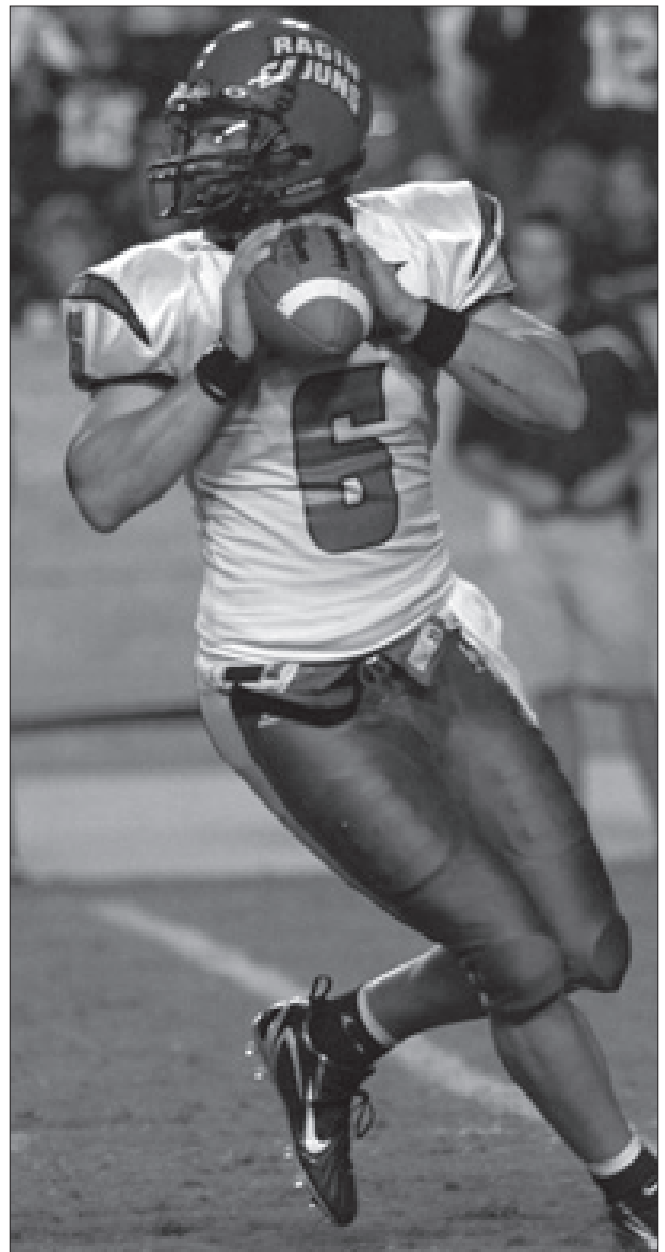

Venable was a freshman in 1998, but didn't finish his career until the 2005 season. After missing 42 of 56 games during his first five years, the NCAA granted him an unprecedented three-year extension following the 2002 season.

With a degree already in hand, Venable returned to the field as a deep snapper and didn't miss a game. He played in 34 straight contests and his final game was the clincher for the Cajuns' 2005 Sun Belt Championship.
