Play-by-play announcer **Jay Walker** has served as the "Voice of the Ragin' Cajuns" since 1991. He handles the play-by-play duties for Cajuns football, men's basketball and baseball.

A broadcasting veteran since 1971, the native New Englander has spent his entire broadcasting career in southwest Louisiana. His sports background includes years of broadcasting high school sports, while also serving

as the television play-by-play voice of Ragin' Cajuns athletics from 1984-91 before joining the radio network.

In addition to his duties with the network, Walker also hosts the Rickey Bustle, Bob Marlin and Tony Robichaux Coach's Shows on MyKLAF-TV (Cox/LUS 13, DirecTV 62). He is also the host of the popular sports talk show, "Bird's Eye View," which airs Monday-Friday from 3-6 p.m. on ESPN 1420 AM.

### STEVE PELOQUIN

Color Analyst



Sports Radio ESPN 1420 Programming Director **Steve Pelouquin** has served as color analyst for the Ragin' Cajuns Radio Network since 2002.

Pelouquin is the football color analyst and is the primary play-by-play voice for women's basketball and softball.

Under his guidance, coverage of women's basketball and softball has increased to nearly 100 live events since 2007-08,

with plans for even further expansion.

A broadcasting veteran since 1991, Pelouquin hosts the always entertaining morning sports show, "Thinking Out Loud," which airs Monday-Friday from 7-9 a.m. on ESPN 1420 AM.

### DIRECTIONS TO CAJUN FIELD

#### Traveling West/East (Interstate 10)

- From I-10, take Exit 100 (Ambassador Caffery) and turn south. Travel south approximately three miles. Follow signs to Bertrand Drive/Cajundome. Take a left onto Congress Street. Go approximately 1/8 mile on Congress Street and turn right into the first parking lot, Gate 3.

#### Traveling South (Interstate 49)

- From I-49, exit onto I-10 West (toward Lake Charles). Then, follow the directions above from I-10.

#### Traveling West/Northwest (Highway 90)

- U.S. Highway 90 is known as Evangeline Thruway in Lafayette. Turn left onto University Avenue and go approximately 2.5 miles. Then turn left onto Congress Street. Cajun Field will be on your left. Turn left into the parking lot just past the stadium marked Gate 3.

#### From Lafayette Regional Airport

- Exiting the airport, turn left onto Surrey Street. Once you cross Evangeline Hwy., Surrey Street becomes University Avenue. Turn left onto Congress Street. Cajun Field will be on your left. Turn left into the parking lot just past the stadium marked Gate 3.

## COVERING LOUISIANA

### Rickey Bustle Availability

Head coach **Rickey Bustle** will be available for interviews on Monday during the Sun Belt Coaches Teleconference and at his weekly luncheon. He is also available in his office from 8:30-9:00 a.m. and 2:30-3:15 p.m., Monday-Thursday, for telephone and in-person interviews. Once a request is approved by the SID, **Judy Becker** will schedule an appointment.

### Player Availability

**■ MEDIA MEMBERS SHOULD NEVER CONTACT A STUDENT-ATHLETE DIRECTLY AT ANY TIME.**

■ That contact rule begins the minute the S-A enrolls in school as a freshman until the time they run out of eligibility – off-season and summers included. Contact includes, but is not limited to, in-person interviews outside of an athletic event or practice, phone calls, text messages, email and any other form of online communication (ie. Facebook, MySpace, etc.).

■ Student-athletes have been instructed to immediately terminate any contact initiated by a member of the media.

■ Player interviews **MUST** be arranged through the SID office. During the season, select Cajuns players are available to the media twice a week, typically Tuesdays and Wednesdays. To arrange an interview, please call or email **Daryl Cetnar** at least 48 hours in advance. Post-practice interview requests for coaches & players must be made by 1 p.m. that day. Those interviews will be conducted in the Bob Fournet Recruiting Zone behind the Cox Communications Athletic Center. Players will not be available for game-day interviews until the post-game press conference. **Interviews will always be scheduled around a student-athlete's academic schedule.**

### ■ 2010 Football Student-Athlete Availability

**Sunday** – Practice Open – No coach or player interviews  
**Monday** – Players Day off (except those brought to Media Luncheon), coaches available by appointment

**Tuesday** – Practice Open – Interviews after practice

**Wednesday** – Practice Open – Interviews after practice

**Thursday** – Practice Open – No player interviews

**Friday** – Walk-through closed – No interviews

**Saturday** – Post-Game only

(all availability subject to change at any time without prior notice)

### Practices

■ **Practices are open to the media on Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday only, but may be closed at any time upon announcement. Media should contact the SID office if they plan to attend practice and should be aware of the designated areas around the practice field from which to view practice.**

■ Video crews shooting footage during practice, though, are asked to limit their filming to the first 30 minutes.

The official site of the Sun Belt Conference, [sunbeltsports.org](http://sunbeltsports.org), features the most current media guide, game notes and updated statistics during the regular season.

### Injury Information

■ The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) regulates the use and disclosure of certain information held by "covered entities". It establishes regulations for the use and disclosure of Protected Health Information (PHI). PHI is any information held by a covered entity which concerns health status and provision of health care that can be linked to an individual. This is interpreted rather broadly and includes any part of an individual's medical record.

■ **HIPAA Privacy Rule.** Under the HIPAA Privacy Rule, the University must reasonably limit uses and disclosures of medical information to the minimum necessary to accomplish their intended purpose. In order to supply the media with injury information related to student-athletes, the University shall be limited to discussing the athlete's name, along with a broad term for the injury and upcoming playing status.

■ Student-athletes that miss practice due to an injury will not be available to the media for post-practice interviews.

■ Student-athletes that are injured during a game will not be allowed to participate in post-game media interviews.

■ **Members of the media should never approach athletic trainers to discuss the injury of a student-athlete.** All covering news outlets, including live television and radio broadcasts, will be supplied with in-game injury information by the SID.

■ The SID office, in association with the athletic trainer, will have an injury report available to the media on Wednesday.

### Game Notes

■ During the season, football game notes will be available on Mondays at Noon to media members and will also be available at [www.ragincajuns.com](http://www.ragincajuns.com).

■ In addition, a late Monday release will contain highlights from head coach Rickey Bustle's Monday press luncheon. A mid-week practice report and other necessary game information will be released late Wednesday.

### Working Press Area

■ The entrance to the Cajun Field press box is through the press elevator, located at Gate B adjacent to the elevator tower on the west side of Cajun Field.

■ The press box opens approximately three hours prior to game time and meals will be served in the press box beginning approximately 90 minutes to kickoff.

■ Working media credentials are required for admittance to the press box and for meals.

■ The Level 1 area is reserved for media members as well as game staff and statistical personnel. Broadcast outlets, coaches booths and game management areas are located on Level 2. The camera deck is located below Level 1.

■ The press area, as well as the Cox Communications Media Room, is equipped with high-speed wireless internet. Media and photographers can access the network with the proper log-in information. Please contact the SID staff for help.

■ Electrical outlets and telephone lines are available on a first-come, first-served basis in the working press area and Media Room.

### Press Box Media Services

■ Pre-game notes, programs, guides and statistics along with other information will be provided to all media members prior to kickoff. Play-by-play and stat sheets are provided at the end of each quarter. Live running stats are also available via monitors throughout press row and on the internet at [www.ragincajuns.com](http://www.ragincajuns.com) during the game.

■ Internal public address provides updated information and notes throughout the game as well as play-by-play particulars.

■ Members of the UL SID staff will man the press box phone number, (337) 851-2255, which should be used for any questions or information needed during the game.

■ **Louisiana and the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) jointly remind you that the Cajun Field press box is a working press facility and that cheering for either team will not be tolerated. Violators will be asked to leave by security personnel.**

## CREDENTIAL & PARKING POLICIES AND GUIDELINES

Credentials, parking passes and working space for all media members are issued at the sole and exclusive discretion of the UL SID office.

**Media must request credentials in writing** through SID Daryl Cetnar at [sportsinfo@louisiana.edu](mailto:sportsinfo@louisiana.edu). The SID Office should receive all credential requests no later than 10 days prior to the game. All season credential requests must be made at least two weeks prior to the season.

**ANY ATTEMPT TO REPLICATE A PARKING PASS OR CREDENTIAL FOR THE INTENT OF DISTRIBUTION WILL RESULT IN A PERMANENT LOSS OF PRIVILEGES.**

**Requests from individuals not employed by a legitimate media outlet WILL NOT be considered.**

### Working Credentials

■ With the exception of those covering the Ragin' Cajuns daily, all passes are issued on a game-by-game basis with consideration of available working space.

■ Louisiana reserves the right to deny media credentials to any individual.

■ Requests will be honored from sports editors of daily newspapers and sports directors of TV and radio stations.

■ Time permitting, credentials will be mailed. However, in the event that credentials cannot be mailed, they can be picked up at Media Will Call which is located at Gate B at the base of the Cajun Field elevator tower. During the week, credentials may be picked up in the SID Office located in Room 140 of the Cox Communications Athletic Center.

■ Credentials are non-transferable and are subject to immediate revocation at any time, if transferred.

■ Only websites that are affiliated with a national or regional news media organization (CNN/SI, ESPN, etc.) or an opposing institution will be considered for credentials.

■ Web sites that sponsor "message boards" or "chat rooms" where people are allowed to post anonymously are ineligible for credentials and access to media functions.

■ If a news-gathering medium has an on-line site that sponsors these anonymous forums, they may continue to request credentials under its traditional medium (newspaper, magazine, radio or television), but will not be granted additional passes or access for on-line staff. **ALL passes can be revoked if the traditional medium fails to monitor its anonymous forum for malicious defamation against the University and its' coaches, student-athletes and administrators.**

■ All media members are asked to enter the stadium through the media gate located adjacent to Gate B at the base of the Cajun Field elevator tower.

### Media Parking

■ Media parking at Cajun Field is available on a limited basis in a designated lot. Requests for parking passes should be made well in advance to the SID office. It should not be assumed that parking passes will be provided to all media. Passes must be displayed in the front windshield at all times (you will not be allowed in the parking area without a parking pass).

**Postgame**  
 ■ Requested Cajuns players and head coach Rickey Bustle are available in the interview room following the mandatory 10-minute cooling-off period.  
 ■ **The Louisiana locker room is CLOSED to the media at all times. Media outlets may request players to be brought to the interview room for post-game interviews.**  
 ■ The Cajun Field elevator will be held for working press midway through the fourth quarter and will promptly leave with 5:00 left on the clock to take media members to the post-game interview area. Members of the UL Sports Information staff will escort media to the interview room (located in the auxiliary building behind the Cox Communications Athletic Center) and will be available to handle requests.

**Postgame Media Services**  
 ■ Game books and Louisiana player and coach quotes will be distributed in the media work room. The media work room is located in the Cox Communications Athletic Center, Room 140. **All media members are asked to complete their game stories in the media work room.**  
 ■ UL will provide complimentary fax/email service for media by request only. Should you need information faxed or emailed, please contact a member of the Louisiana SID staff.

**Credential Priority**  
 Credentials are issued based on the following priorities and guidelines:  
 1. Personnel involved in a live radio or TV broadcast.  
 2. Daily newspapers and media outlets regularly covering Louisiana and the current opponent. Wire services, regional and national publications are also afforded this opportunity.  
 3. Non-originating radio and television personnel producing reports on the game. Only local radio and TV stations with a full-time sports director conducting a regular sports show will receive consideration for credentials.  
 4. Officially recognized UL or opponent student publications or electronic media outlets.  
 5. Non-daily newspapers or publications covering the game.

**NOTE: Spouses, dates, non-workers and anyone under 18 years of age are not permitted in the working press area.**

**CREDENTIALS MUST BE VISIBLE AT ALL TIMES.**

**Visiting SID/AD**  
 ■ Three seats, two electrical outlets, and a phone line, (337) 262-5826, are reserved for visiting SIDs. Contact **Daryl Cetnar** in advance to make specific arrangements. Please provide 35 copies of your game notes, or email a final pdf no later than Thursday of game week.  
 ■ Passes for the travel party will be sent by Daryl Cetnar to the visiting SID, unless otherwise instructed. Please make your entire credential request at least 10 days prior to the game. Teams will be allotted 50 sideline passes and 10 additional passes for the coaches booth and video staff. No more than 10 all-access passes will be granted.  
 ■ Each visiting athletics director is given a private box. The box is located on the second floor of the press box. Enter door marked "Visiting AD Box". Ten tickets will be sent to the attention of the visiting SID, along with all travel party passes.

**Photo Requests**  
 ■ Requests for still and action photos of current student-athletes must be made in writing to **Daryl Cetnar**. Still and action photos of former student-athletes are available on a very limited basis. Media outlets should make requests well in advance of any deadline. Headshots of current student-athletes can be accessed via [www.ragincajuns.com](http://www.ragincajuns.com). Contact the SID staff for instructions on how to download the 3.0"x3.5", 300dpi, images.

**Sidelines and Live Photography**  
 ■ **The sidelines at Cajun Field are an extension of the press box and are limited to working personnel only.** NCAA guidelines are enforced, with photographers not allowed to shoot within the confines of the 25-yard-lines on either side of the field. Credentials are required on the sidelines. **Photographers and videographers that shoot in the team area will be removed from the sidelines and may have their credential privileges revoked.**  
 ■ Photographers wishing to work the sideline areas should notify the SID staff well in advance of the game.  
 ■ It is against NCAA and University rules to sell any image taken at a practice or during a game - especially, but not limited to, current student-athletes.  
 ■ **The photo deck is located below the Cajun Field press box and is accessible through the working press area.** All team film and television taping should be done from this area. Credentials are required for this area.  
 ■ Visiting team videographers should contact Darren Walker, Video Coordinator, at (337) 482-6872 for specific information.

**Television**  
 ■ Television rights are retained by the Louisiana Athletics Department and any station desiring to originate either live or delayed broadcasts must contact Scott Farmer, Senior Associate Athletics Director at (337) 482-5393.

**Visiting Radio**  
 ■ Radio rights for Louisiana football are owned by KPFL Radio. Stations wishing to receive their broadcast or needing more information about the network may contact Jay Walker at (337) 233-6000 or by e-mail at [jay@espn1420.com](mailto:jay@espn1420.com).  
 ■ Only the "official" radio outlet of the visiting team is permitted to originate a live broadcast without written permission of the UL Athletics Department. **Two standard analog telephone lines are provided by KPFL in the visiting radio booth.** The University provides a dry-pair line from the visiting radio booth to the visiting locker room. Please contact the SID office at least two weeks in advance if you will be using the dry-pair connection.  
 ■ If the official visiting radio station needs additional analog telephone lines or ISDN lines, please contact AT&T directly to place your order. The physical address of Cajun Field is 2351 West Congress St., Lafayette, LA 70506. Allow 4-6 weeks for installation.  
 ■ Radio booths are located on the second level of the press box. The visiting radio booth is located adjacent to the public address booth. Look for signs marked "PA / Visiting Radio".  
 ■ Other visiting stations desiring to originate broadcasts must get approval from UL SID **Daryl Cetnar** before any arrangements will be made or credentials issued.

 ■ Each Monday during the regular season, **Rickey Bustle** will hold a weekly media luncheon beginning at noon in Room 140 of the Cox Communications Athletic Center. **This event is open ONLY to credentialed members of the media.**  
 ■ Lunch will be served between 12-12:15 p.m. with Bustle's opening comments scheduled to follow shortly after. Schedule permitting, student-athletes may be available to address the media during this time (if there are not class conflicts). Media are asked to arrive early.

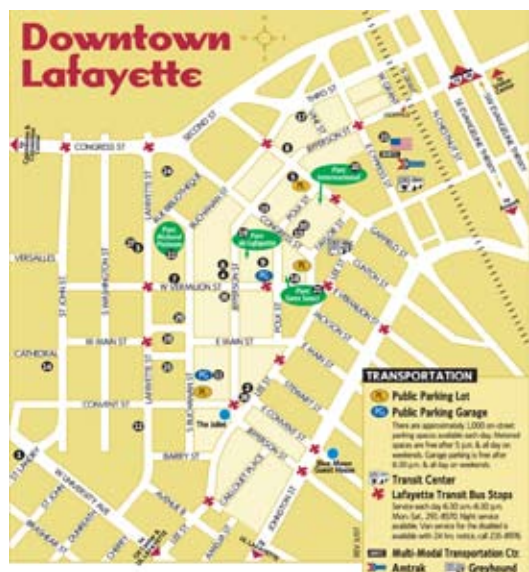

## LOUISIANA'S RECENT NOTEWORTHY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Louisiana's Mathematics Department is one of the Top 100 university math departments in the nation, according to the National Science Foundation. The University's Computer Science Department is among the top 60 university computer science departments.
- The Ragin' Cajuns softball team made its fifth trip to the Women's College World Series in May 2008. In the WCWS opening game, UL defeated the No. 1 team in the nation, the Florida Gators.
- The **National Incident Management Systems and Advanced Technologies** Institute, which is using supercomputers and visualization technologies to try to improve disaster management by public and private sectors, was established in October 2007. NIMSAT's Business Emergency Operations Center will be housed in Abdalla Hall.
- The University of Louisiana is the only university in the State of Louisiana that has a simulated neonatal, pediatric and labor delivery unit. Its Maternal/Child Life Skills laboratory recently opened in Wharton Hall. There, senior nursing students in the College of Nursing and Allied Health Professions use sophisticated computerized simulators that can mimic real-world hospital situations.
- The **Ernest J. Gaines Center** in Dupré Library will house the only complete collection of Gaines' scholarship in the world. It will be built in a now-unfurnished section of the library's third floor. Gaines, author of "The Autobiography of Miss Jane Pittman" and "A Lesson Before Dying," is writer-in-residence emeritus. He was presented with an honorary doctorate from UL in May 2008.
- The University's College of Sciences was named the **Ray P. Authement College of Sciences** in May 2008 in honor of Dr. Ray Authement, The University of Louisiana's fifth president.
- The University of Louisiana is one of the most affordable universities in the nation, thanks to comprehensive scholarship and financial aid programs, including out-of-state fee waivers to qualified students.
- The University is one among 20 teams chosen worldwide to compete in the U.S. Department of Energy's Solar Decathlon next year. The teams will each design, build and operate a small energy-efficient house that's powered entirely by the sun. UL's **Beausoleil Team** represents collaboration among the School of Architecture and Design, College of Engineering and the College of Business.
- In March 2008, the university activated First Call, an interactive communications network that uses voice, e-mail and text to alert registered users to emergencies on campus.

## IMPACT LOUISIANA

- The University of Louisiana employs about 1,575 local citizens and through spending, sustains more than 12,800 jobs in the Lafayette area.
- If it were a private business, the university would rank 5th in the Top 100 private businesses in Acadiana.
- UL's total economic impact is \$650 million to \$700 million in Acadiana each year.
- The University of Louisiana pays more than \$65 million in annual salaries and wages.
- Students are responsible for \$129 million in direct spending annually.
- The university injects about \$149 million of direct, unrestricted spending into the Lafayette economy per year.

## CAMPUS

- The University of Louisiana owns a total of about 1,400 acres. Its main campus consists of 137 acres; the athletic complex and Cajundome sit on 243 acres; University Research Park has 148 acres; the Center for Ecology and Environmental Technology has 51 acres; and the Equine Center is comprised of 100 acres.
- UL has a 600-acre farm/renewable resources laboratory with a 30-acre pond for crawfish and catfish culture in Cade, La.
- It also owns the 100-acre New Iberia Research Center in New Iberia, La., which is one of the largest private non-human, primate breeding colonies in the world.
- UL maintains more than 261 campus buildings that have a total of about 4.2 million square feet.
- The **Cajundome** is a 12,800-seat multipurpose arena. There is an adjacent \$13 million convention center
- **Edith Garland Dupré Library** is one of the most technologically advanced university libraries in Louisiana.

## ACADEMICS

- 100 percent of all undergraduate programs at UL that are eligible for accreditation by professional agencies are accredited.
- UL is a member of the Southeastern Universities Research Association, which is composed of members from more than a dozen southeastern states and the District of Columbia. Other members include Duke, Vanderbilt and Auburn universities.
- The Carnegie Foundation has designated Louisiana-Lafayette as a "Research University with High Research Activity." That puts UL in the same category as Clemson, Auburn and Baylor universities. The only other Louisiana institution in the same category is the University of New Orleans.
- The University of Louisiana is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.
- Louisiana offers 80 undergraduate degree programs.
- There are 29 master's degree programs and one post master's certificate program.
- Doctor of Philosophy degrees are offered in applied language and speech sciences, biology, cognitive science, English, Francophone studies, mathematics, computer science and computer engineering. A joint doctor of education degree is offered in educational leadership by UL and Southeastern Louisiana University.
- About 1,200 students are graduated each fall and spring.

## The Cajuns Offense

Offensive coordinator/offensive line coach Ron Hudson and passing game coordinator/quarterbacks coach Jorge Munoz enter their third season together running the Cajuns attack.

Heading into the spring of 2009, UL lost quarterback Michael Desormeaux, running back Tyrell Fenroy and wide receiver Jason Chery from one of the best offenses in team history. The spring of 2010 was not as tough, as the Cajuns lost six starters, but returned their key offensive weapons from last season.

The biggest hit was the loss of three starting offensive linemen to a line that placed 13th in the nation in fewest sacks allowed. The team lost two First Team All-Sun Belt linemen (Brad Bustle & Chris Fisher) and a left tackle who started 24 consecutive games (Kyle Pirtle).

The Cajuns won in 2009 when the offensive line was at its best. UL allowed a total of only three sacks in six victories. With an upright quarterback, the Cajuns were 112-of-182 passing (61.5%) with seven passing TD's to just one interception in the team's six victories.

Junior **Chris Masson** will run the offense as the starting quarterback, with sophomore **Blaine Gautier** expected as backup. Gautier will get time on the field in the wildcat formation. H-back **Brad McGuire** will be utilized as a situational substitute under center and in the wildcat.

The running back position will be up for grabs, as the coaching staff has not guaranteed anyone playing time. Fullback **Matt Desormeaux** will be used in a variety of blocking, rushing and receiving roles.

The receiving corps is deep and experienced. Of the seven lettermen, six are upperclassmen. Look for **Marlin Miller** to be the main target. He led UL in catches (37), yards (325) and touchdowns (2) in '09.

Six-foot-six tight end **Ladarius Green** provides the big target. Green was on the 2009 John Mackey Award Watch List and led in receiving yards (533) and yards per catch (16.7), despite missing three games due to injury. A second receiving option at tight end will develop from sophomore **Brandon Williams** or one of the team's redshirt freshmen, **Jacob Maxwell** or **Ian Thompson**.



CHRIS MASSON

### Quarterback

- The Cajuns saw **Chris Masson** emerge as their starting quarterback last fall and provide solid play under center.

- Masson directed the team to the 16th best red zone efficiency in the nation (89%), the 36th best third-down conversion percentage (42.4%) and the 49th best passing offense in football (224.8ypg).

- Masson posted nine games of 200-plus yards of total offense, just one game shy of tying the school single-season record. He ranks ninth all-time in total offense (2,694). His 222 completions in 2009 rank as the third-best single-season total – just two shy of the school record.

- Masson posted 2,406 yards passing, the fourth best single-season output and ranks eighth all-time in passing (2,478) in Cajuns history.

- Sophomore **Blaine Gautier** will be the backup quarterback, but showed he is capable of leading the offense.

- In limited action last season, Gautier hit on 9-of-17 passes for 119 yards and a touchdown, while adding 24 rushing yards and a touchdown.

- Gautier will do more than serve as a traditional backup quarterback. Expect the speedy sophomore to be used in situational play.

- Sophomore **Brady Thomas** has a rocket arm and has two seasons in the offense, making him a valuable reserve.

- The coaching staff expects that using Gautier and quarterback/fullback **Brad McGuire** as situational substitutes will add more diversity to the offense.



YOBES WALKER

### Running Back

- The Cajuns lost both starters in the backfield in running back Undrea Sails and fullback Geoffrey McCullough. The good news is that the team has dealt with the loss of Sails since the sixth week of the 2009 season and McCullough has been replaced with three outstanding players.

- Junior **Julian Shankle** ran well in the spring and leads the pack at running back, along with sophomore **Draylon Booker**. Both dealt with spring injuries, leaving a lot of questions in the backfield.

- Freshman **Robert Walker** enrolled in the spring and immediately showed why the Cajuns have high hopes for the Mamou, La., product. A hamstring injury forced Walker to shut it down midway through the spring, but he will be back in the fall ready for playing time.

- The coaching staff expects stiff competition at running back with the addition of incoming backs **Kevis Streeter** and **Aaron Spikes**. Both enter camp with the opportunity to earn playing time right away, as the starting job was declared open heading into fall camp.

- The Cajuns moved quarterback **Brad McGuire** to running back in the spring after a rash of injuries and he showed more than enough to become the team's H-back for the 2010 season. McGuire will be used in a variety of sets, including the wildcat, as well as a slot receiver, running back and fullback.

- Senior **Matt Desormeaux** and sophomore **Yobes Walker** will provide more of a traditional fullback role.

- Desormeaux saw increased playing time as the 2009 season unfolded, proving to be a valuable and diversified asset. He was used as a rushing and blocking fullback, as well as a receiving and blocking tight end.

**LADARIUS GREEN**

### Receivers & Tight Ends

- Wide receiver **Marlin Miller** leads a deeply experienced corps of pass catchers.
- Seniors **Miller**, **Richie Falgout**, and **Vernon Wolfe**, juniors **Pierre Hill** and **Andrew Joseph** and sophomore **Javone Lawson** supply plenty of options. The aforementioned group totaled 111 receptions for 1,093 yards and six touchdowns in 2009.
- Miller led all wide receivers with 37 catches for 325 yards, despite spending part of the year at running back.
- Departed tight end **Luke Aubrey** led the team last year in receptions and touchdowns. Junior tight end **Ladarius Green** should have no problem picking up the slack.
- The six-foot-six Green was a John Mackey Award Watch Lister and All-Sun Belt selection.
- Green led the Cajuns in receiving yards (533) and yards per catch (16.7), despite missing three games due to injury. He ranked third in the Sun Belt in receiving yards per game and tallied the longest reception in the conference (91 yards) – it was the third longest reception in school history and fourth longest in SBC history.
- Green made 18 receptions in five conference games, boasting 19.3 yards per catch and 69.4 yards per game, ranking third in yards-per-game and third in yards-per-catch among all receivers in the SBC.
- Sophomore tight end **Brandon Williams** ignites the Cajuns running game. Redshirt freshmen **Jacob Maxwell** and **Ian Thompson** showed flashes in the spring and should continue to develop. All three must continue to mature and are expected to be valuable pieces of the Cajuns offense.



**IAN BURKS**

### Offensive Line

- The team lost three senior starters on the offensive line, two of which were All-Sun Belt performers.
- There are 11 veteran linemen returning to compete for starting spots in the fall.
- Veteran senior **Ian Burks** moved from guard to center and should solidify the position after losing a four-year starter in **Chris Fisher**. Burks has 31 career starts at right guard and one start at center (at Nebraska, 2009).
- Seniors **Colin Windsor** and **Jonathan Decoster** left spring drills as the starting tackles.
- Like Burks, **Decoster** owns 31 career starts, all at right tackle. **Decoster** was named honorable mention All-Sun Belt in 2008 and is capable of another fine season.
- Inexperienced tackles **Nasser Jamal** and **Robert Robinson** will be expected to make progress in the fall to provide depth.
- The offensive line took its share of growing pains during the spring, especially with **Jamal** and **Robertson** attempting to play alongside new guards with a new center making the calls.
- Sophomores **Leonardo Bates** (6-5, 327) and **Jaron Odom** (6-7, 337) enter the fall with the nod at guard.
- Guards **Kyle Plouhar** (6-7, 296) and **Evan Ruiz** (6-5, 310) will press **Bates** and **Odom** for starting jobs.
- The plan is to roll personnel at guard, meaning all four players should see time on the field.

## The Cajuns Defense

The Cajuns defense, known by their motto, TNT (tackles and turnovers), improved for the second straight season under defensive coordinator Kevin Fouquier. The defense allowed fewer points, less yards per game and created more turnovers in 2009 than in the previous season.

The Cajuns 16 interceptions were the most since 1994 (19). UL was 2nd in the SBC and 23rd in the NCAA in picks. The defense ranked 29th nationally in turnovers gained.

UL was 6-2 in 2009 when the defense forced at least two turnovers.

The team's biggest loss on defense was their team leader and middle linebacker Antwyne Zanders. Zanders led the squad with 103 tackles and 10 tackles-for-loss in 2009. He finished his career with 308 total tackles, the third most by a linebacker in school history and his 27.5 tackles-for-loss were just shy of the career top 5.

With most of the defense returning, the unit should be improved again in 2010. Look for the defensive line to make great strides with the addition of JC's **Benay Pryer**, **Bernard Smith** and **Chris Tucker**, as well as the return of **Nate Douglas**, who sat out last season.

The linebackers enjoy a great mix of veteran leadership and upcoming young talent, while the secondary is loaded with veterans, plus two JUCO transfers.

### Defensive Line

- The team lost both players who occupied the rush end position in 2009 (Hall Davis and Chris Lanaux). Junior **Nate Douglas** took little time to shake off the rust and earn that starting position. Douglas looks to build on a freshman season in which he led all defensive linemen in tackles and tackles-for-loss.

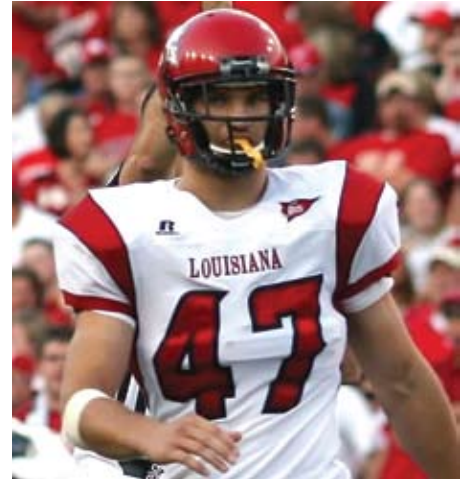
- Redshirt freshman defensive end **Justin Anderson** showed potential and was going to be counted on to contribute, but broke his leg early in the spring.

- Junior college transfer **Bernard Smith** entered the defensive end rotation thanks to a strong spring. He has the look of an All-Conference performer.

- **Jesse Broadnax** looked good in the spring at defensive end and will be called on to contribute.

- **Terrell Richardson** holds his starting position at the other end and will be spelled by **Emeka Onyenekwu** and **Tyrell Gaddies**. Richardson has been a leader on the Cajuns defensive line, playing in all 36 games during his three seasons, starting 30. Gaddies sat out the spring to focus on academics, allowing Onyenekwu, who didn't play much in 2009, to take all the reps behind Richardson.

- Five of the six players in the defensive tackle rotation return. Senior **Jordan Topp** and junior **Derreck Dean** will start inside. Senior **Jermaine Rogers** will back up Topp. JUCO transfer **Benay Pryer** will compete with senior **Sharrick Moore** for playing time behind Dean.



GRANT FLEMING

### Linebacker

- Senior **Grant Fleming**, a two-time All-Sun Belt selection, made a smooth transition from strong side linebacker to middle linebacker during the spring. Known as a smart player, he will be counted on to take the reins as a senior leader on defense.

- Fleming's back-ups will be juniors **Richard Brooks** and **Kyron Benoit**. Brooks has the ability, but he's been hampered by injuries. Benoit was rushed into action as a true freshman. Both players started games in 2008.

- Junior **Devon Lewis-Buchanan** was Fleming's back-up in 2009 and slides into the starting role ahead of redshirt freshman **Brandon Nash**. Nash had a good spring and should play in the fall.

- Senior **Daylon McCoy** has been an underrated contributor the last two seasons as the other starting linebacker. The weakside linebacker should thrive in the Cajuns blitzing defensive packages and McCoy is no exception.

- McCoy placed fifth in tackles and was third on the team with 4.5 tackles-for-loss in 2009 despite missing three games due to injury. He started six games in 2008 and tied for the team lead in tackles, while leading the 2008 squad in sacks and interceptions and was second in tackles-for-loss.

- Like Nash, redshirt freshman **Andrew Hebert** had a good spring and is expected to receive playing time behind McCoy.

### Block Party

Since Coach Bustle's arrival, the Cajuns have blocked 41 kicks, ranking third in the nation over that span. Scoring on special team's blocks has been special for the Cajuns, accumulating seven touchdowns, one safety and one defensive extra point. In 2003, the Cajuns returned two blocked field goals for touchdowns to set a NCAA single-season record. Charles Tillman was the last Cajuns player to block two kicks in the same game when he stuffed two punts at Arkansas in 2002. As a team, UL has blocked two kicks in the same game seven times under Bustle. The Cajuns have blocked 18 field goals, 12 punts and 11 extra points since 2002.

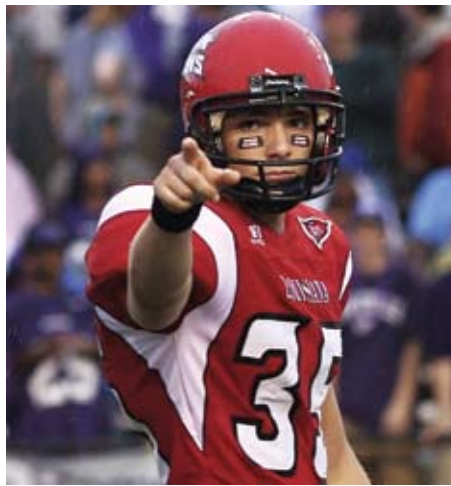

**Secondary**

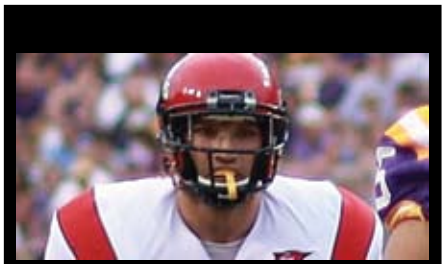
- Senior **Orkeys Auriene** and junior **Dwight "Bill" Bentley** hold down their starting spots at cornerback.
- Auriene tied for the team lead in passes defended, while leading the Cajuns in pass break-ups – the sixth most passes defended in the SBC.
- Bentley, an All-Sun Belt selection in 2009, led all defensive backs in tackles and ranked fourth with 58 tackles. He tied for the team lead with three interceptions, while breaking-up five passes.
- Junior **Melvin White** is the Cajuns starter in the nickel package.
- Spring newcomer and junior college transfer **Lionel Stokes** showed enough to warrant a spot on the two-deep alongside sophomore **Rodney Gillis** and senior **Julian Jones**.
- Junior **Lance Kelley** and senior **Maurice Rolle, Jr.**, entered the spring as the incumbent starters at safety and held off hungry backups.
- University of Hawaii and Gulf Coast CC transfer **Le'Marcus Gibson** will continue to press Kelley for the starting job, while redshirt freshman **Winston Burnette** lurks behind Rolle.



**SPENCER ORTEGO**

**Special Teams**

- Special teams are extremely important to Coach Bustle. The work has always paid off, as the Cajuns have blocked 41 kicks since 2002 – the third most in the nation.
- Senior **Tyler Albrecht** returns as the starting kicker. He had a solid debut season, making 8-of-11 field goals in 2009. His first career attempt may be his most memorable – a 48-yarder in the closing seconds to help UL upset Kansas State. His only misses came from 29 (blocked), 49 and 50 yards.
- **Brett Baer** handled kickoffs in 2009, but will face a challenge from incoming freshman **Hunter Stover**.
- Stover was known in high school for his booming kickoffs into the end zone. The Cajuns tied for 112th nationally (alongside Army, Eastern Michigan, Georgia Tech, New Mexico & South Carolina) with just one touchback on a kickoff in 2009.
- Senior **Spencer Ortego**, a 2009 First Team All-Sun Belt selection, is entrenched as the punter.
- Ortego helped UL lead the Sun Belt in net punting thanks to a 40.6 punting average and just a 1.9-yard per return average. He was tops in the SBC, allowing only 21 punt return yards during conference play.
- **Orkeys Auriene** led the team last season in punt returns, averaging 9.0 yards per return, with a long of 25 yards. **Marlin Miller**, **Javone Lawson** and **Auriene** will be the favorites to return kickoffs.

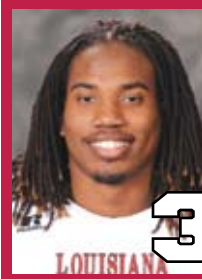

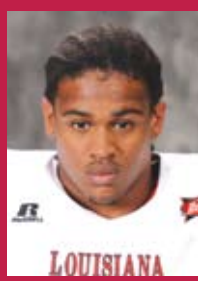

## WHO WE ARE

*The story behind our name and nickname.*

### Our Name

We were founded in 1898 by a legislative act authorized by Senator Robert Martin (the main administrative building was later named in his honor). Although several towns competed to be the site of the new school, Lafayette was chosen by virtue of a donation of 25 acres of land by the Girard family. The community also offered \$8,000 and a ten-year property tax to supplement state appropriations. In 1900, the first campus buildings were constructed and Southwestern Louisiana Industrial Institute opened its doors on Sept. 18, 1901. Dr. Edwin L. Stephens was named the first president, as SLII started with 100 students and eight faculty members. In 1921, the school became known as Southwestern Louisiana Institute when it was designated as one of the state's institutions of higher learning. Upon achieving university status in 1960, our name was changed to the University of Southwestern Louisiana. That name lasted until 1999 and was replaced by the University of Louisiana at Lafayette. Athletically, using the reference "at Lafayette" is not necessary in the same examples as North Carolina at Chapel Hill, Texas at Austin and Tennessee at Knoxville.

### Our Nickname and Mascot

In 1921, then-SLI adopted the nickname and mascot Bulldogs. The first use was a drawing voted on by the student body. Famous architect Hays Town did the first rendition of the bulldog while he was a student.

The first use of a live mascot dates back to 1937. During the 1937-38 school year, the first dog was actually a pit bull. The following season, the school used an English bulldog as its mascot and continued to use English bulldogs every season with one exception. In 1943-44, the school mascot was a stray dog named Willoughby.

For the next several years, all bulldogs were named "Gee" after the popular coach George Mitchell. Mitchell served as boxing coach from 1940-1942 and head football coach from 1947-49, compiling an 18-8-1 record on the gridiron.

Beginning in 1963, just a few seasons after the name change to USL, university football teams were dubbed the "Raging Cajuns" by then-Sports Information Director Bob Henderson and head football coach Russ Faulkinberry. In addition, the team switched from gold helmets to white helmets with an Acadian flag. At the time, more than 90 percent of Faulkinberry's team was composed of Louisiana high school players, many with French-speaking Acadian backgrounds.

The "Raging Cajuns" nickname stuck, and in 1967 the second "g" was dropped to form the word Ragin'. In the early 1970's other sports teams began to adopt the Ragin' Cajuns nickname. The University made a full switch to Ragin' Cajuns during the 1974-75 school year as part of "Operation Turnaround".

Even though the nickname had changed, USL continued to use a bulldog as its mascot until the early 1970's. In 1982, USL debuted its new mascot, named Mr. Cajun, a shotgun-carrying hunter riding a giant crawfish. The design was chosen from a student-submitted contest. Mr. Cajun was quickly replaced by Cajun Man, but in 1984, the Fabulous Cajun Chicken was introduced and became a wildly popular unofficial mascot who entertained fans for more than a decade. The bulldog mascot, however, was reintroduced as a live English bulldog named Ragin' Cajun from 1990-1996. Red, another English bulldog, debuted in the fall of 1996, but served as the mascot for only one season. Cayenne, the Cajun Pepper, became the new mascot in 2001 and still serves as the mascot today.

The Fabulous Cajun Chicken made a brief return in 2007-08, appearing at a baseball game on Apr. 17, 2007, Football Fan Day on Aug. 12, 2007 and a men's basketball game on Jan. 19, 2008.

**Rickey Bustle**

Louisiana head coach Rickey Bustle has guided the Cajuns for eight seasons and enters his ninth year in Cajun Country in 2010.

Bustle's Cajuns have won six games in four of the past five seasons, a stretch not equaled at UL since 1986-89. In fact, since the 2005 season, only one other Sun Belt school can boast four bowl eligible seasons.

One of Bustle's proudest moments was watching four-time All-Sun Belt selection Tyrell Fenroy become just the seventh player in NCAA history to rush for 1,000 yards in four consecutive seasons.

Bustle is credited with 51 All-Sun Belt selections in addition to the 2005 SBC Freshman of the Year (Tyrell Fenroy), 2006 SBC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year (Jerry Babb), 2008 SBC Offensive Player of the Year (Michael Desormeaux) and 2008 SBC Player of the Year (Fenroy).

In addition to winning the Walter Camp Football Foundation National Offensive Player of the Week, several Ragin' Cajuns under Bustle have been considered for many prestigious national awards, including: Doak Walker Award Watch List & Semifinalist, Lou Groza Award Watch List, Mackey Award Watch List, Outland Trophy Watch List, Rimington Trophy Watch List, Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List and William V. Campbell Trophy Candidate.

Following the 2010 NFL Draft, a total of 19 Ragin' Cajuns coached by Bustle have either been drafted or signed free agent contracts. North of the boarder, Bustle has seen a pair of offensive linemen selected in the CFL Draft - Jesse Newman was the third overall pick in 2008 and Nasser Jamal was the first pick of the sixth round in the 2010. In addition, 11 players have been invited to play in post-season all-star bowl games, with a handful of those players earning multiple invitations.

Under Bustle, the Cajuns have been .500 or better at home in seven of his eight seasons. Louisiana went 4-2 at home in 2009, which included a 17-15 upset over Big XII-member Kansas State. Bustle holds a 24-20 (.546) career record at home.

In addition to raised expectations, Bustle has brought professionalism and discipline to the program. From 2002-09, the Cajuns 591 penalties are the fewest in the Sun Belt Conference and UL boasts the fewest penalties per game over that span.

The fans have also taken notice, as 763,975 have attended games since 2002 for an average of over 17,300 per game. UL has topped 100,000 fans in a season three times since 2004, including 111,998 last season. The Bustle-era owns four of the 15 biggest crowds in Cajun Field history, including a school-record 41,357 to open the 2009 campaign. UL owns has the SBC record for largest home stadium crowd (41,357), second-largest home stadium crowd (33,828) and largest conference game attendance (29,031). The Cajuns led the SBC in attendance in 2004 and 2008.

UL began 2003 with an attendance of 24,211 vs. Louisiana Tech, the largest crowd in seven seasons. Then, in 2004, UL saw a crowd of 25,083 for the Sun Belt opener vs. Middle Tennessee and a five-game total of 107,006, the most since 1996. The massive crowds continued to arrive and in 2008, the team averaged 21,468 fans per game to mark the eighth-best average in Cajun Field history. The 2009 season was even better, as 111,998 flowed into the stadium - the seventh highest single season total and most since 1988. Since 2004, the Cajuns have averaged 21,479 on homecoming.

The Cajuns went 6-5 (.546) in 2005 to mark UL's first winning record since 1995. Along with a winning season in 2005 came a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship. After starting 1-5 (0-2), Louisiana roared back into the SBC race with a come-from-behind road win at Middle Tenn. From there came a homecoming win over Troy in overtime and a second comeback road

win, this time at North Texas. A Senior Day victory over FIU set-up the season finale at La.-Monroe. The Cajuns rocked the Warhawks 54-21, claiming the first school title since the 1994 Big West crown.

Bustle was rewarded with a two-year contract extension following the 2005 campaign, which lengthens his contract through 2010. His contract was extended again following the 2009 season.

Bustle saw his winning percentage increase each of the first four seasons since taking the job in 2002, but regressed to .500 in 2006. His 6-6 record in 2006 was only deemed a regression because of the high standards and raised levels of expectations by the Cajuns and their fans. In fact, Bustle's 12 wins from 2005-06 were the most in a two-year period since 1994-95.

Coach Bustle was victorious 23 times in his first five seasons with the Cajuns from 2002-06, including 11 of the last 17 games. UL won only nine games in the five seasons prior to Bustle's arrival from 1997-2001.

The Summerville, S.C., native, became the 24th head coach in Louisiana's Ragin' Cajuns football history on December 13, 2001.

Bustle earned his first collegiate victory as a head coach on Sept. 21, 2002 with a 34-0 victory over

UAB. Louisiana held the Blazers to just eight first downs and only 94 yards passing.

In 2002, Bustle helped the Cajuns to their first winning record at Cajun Field in six seasons with impressive back-to-back victories over Sun Belt foes Idaho and Arkansas State.

In 2003, UL won four of their last five games en route to a second place finish in the Sun Belt.

More importantly, Bustle's popularity across Acadiana had a significant impact in the stands. As a result, the Cajuns' season ticket base rose by substantial amounts.

**The Ragin' Cajuns have been bowl eligible in four of the past five seasons and have led the Sun Belt Conference in attendance during the 2004 and 2008 seasons.**

For seven seasons prior to his appointment as head coach of the Cajuns, **Bustle served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Va. Tech.** With the Hokies, Bustle developed some of the finest quarterbacks the college football world has seen in recent years.

The list includes former 49er Jim Druckenmiller and former No. 1 overall pick in 2001 Michael Vick.

In fact, Bustle coached the top three quarterbacks on Tech's career list for touchdown passes and guided players who have accounted for eight of the Hokies' Top 10 all-time single-season offensive totals and seven of Tech's Top 10 all-time single season passing totals.

The 1999 Hokies averaged a national-best 41.4 points per game, as Tech played in the national championship game.

**In Bustle's first seven seasons as offensive coordinator, the Hokies fielded seven of the eight highest-scoring teams in school history.**

The team posted a 67-17 record and won three Big East Conference championships. VT went to a bowl game every year he served as offensive coordinator, winning the 1993 Independence Bowl, 1995 Sugar Bowl, 1998 Music City Bowl and 2001 Gator Bowl.

Bustle spent all but one season at Va. Tech from 1987-2001, leaving the Hokies in 1994 for a one-year stint as the offensive coordinator and QB's coach at South Carolina. While at SC, Bustle helped the Gamecocks go from a 4-7 record in 1993 to a 7-5 record and a Carquest Bowl Championship.

From 1987-92, he was the quarterbacks and receivers coach at Tech before moving to offensive coordinator and QB's coach in '93.

His ties to Louisiana include a three-year stint at ULM from 1984-86, where coached the running backs for two seasons before becoming the offensive coordinator and QB's coach.

He has also had coaching stints with East Carolina as a wide receivers and secondary coach (1980-82) and the USFL's Arizona Wranglers as a running backs coach (1983). He broke into the full-time coaching ranks as the defensive coordinator at Gardner-Webb in 1979.

Bustle is a 1976 graduate of Clemson, where he received a bachelor's degree in parks and recreation administration. He was a four-year letterwinner as a wide receiver for the Tigers. As a graduate assistant coach, Bustle earned 27 hours toward a master's degree in Special Education.

Bustle's wife, Lynn, of Charleston, S.C., received her Ph.D. in curriculum and instruction from Virginia Tech in December 1997. She currently is a tenured professor at UL in the Visual Arts Department in the College of the Arts. They have a son, Brad, who was a two-time All-Sun Belt offensive lineman at UL and signed professionally with Hartford of the United Football League.

### Bustle's Discipline

Since 2002, Rickey Bustle's squads have seen the fewest penalty flags in the Sun Belt Conference. Not only do the Cajuns lead the league in the fewest total penalties, UL also leads with a league-low 6.29 penalties per game. In fact, the Cajuns are the only team in the Sun Belt consistently among the fewest penalized. In 2004, Louisiana was flagged for only 61 infractions - the lowest total at UL since 1990.

**Gerald Broussard**

**Gerald Broussard** reclaimed a coaching position at his alma mater in 2008 to coach the defensive line. Broussard, who has been involved with coaching for more than 25 years, had been away from Cajuns football for nearly a decade.

In his first two seasons back with the Cajuns, Broussard coached Hall Davis, who was a fifth round draft choice by the St. Louis Rams in the 2010 NFL Draft.

From 1986-98 he worked at Louisiana under then-head coach Nelson Stokley. During that tenure, Broussard helped guide the Cajuns to seven winning seasons and a pair of Big West Conference Championships. He served as the offensive line coach from 1986-91 before moving to tackles and tight ends from 1992-94. Broussard then coached a wide receivers unit from 1995-98 that was led by standout Brandon Stokley. In 1996, Broussard's receiving corps set the school record for receiving yards with 3,076.

Before returning to the Cajuns, the Lafayette native spent the last three seasons as the offensive coordinator at Stephen F. Austin. In 2005-06 he coached the offensive line and tight ends, and in 2007 the H-backs and fullbacks. During his first season with the Jacks, Broussard's offense finished 13th in the nation in passing and 21st in total offense. The team surrendered only 16 sacks in 2005, despite throwing the ball an average of 43 times per game. Six Jacks received All-Southland Conference recognition.

Broussard spent the prior four seasons with McNeese State, where he served as offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator. The Cowboys won or shared three straight conference titles with Broussard on the staff and were the top scoring team in the SLC in 2002, averaging 31.9 points per game.

Broussard's coaching career started in 1984 as a graduate assistant/tight ends coach for the Cajuns under Sam Robertson.

He was a three-year letterwinner at offensive line for the Cajuns from 1979-83. Broussard was the recipient of the J.C. "Dutch" Reinhardt Award in 1983 for comeback athlete, the same year in which he was named team captain. In 1984, he graduated with a degree in Business Management. In 1995, Broussard was named to the Cajuns first team All 25-Year Team by the Lafayette Daily Advertiser.

Broussard was a standout football and baseball player at Lafayette High School where he was inducted into the Lions Hall of Fame.

He and his wife, Julie, are the parents of a son, John.

**Hurlie Brown**

**Hurlie Brown** began coaching the entire Cajuns secondary in 2008 after having worked exclusively with the cornerbacks in 2007.

The Cajuns had 16 INT's in 2009, with 13 of the 16 picks coming in the team's six victories. It was the most interceptions since 1994 (19) and helped UL rank 2nd in the SBC in picks and 23rd in the NCAA. Dwight Bentley tied for the team lead in interceptions and earned All-Sun Belt honors as just a sophomore.

In 2008, Brown helped safety Derik Keyes earn All-Sun Belt honors in his first season as a full-time starter. The year prior, Brown tutored a mixture of inexperienced and veteran corners, including Kyle Ward, who signed a free agent contract with the Green Bay Packers.

Brown joined Rickey Bustle's staff after serving as defensive backs coach at Florida International from 2001 through 2006. His wealth of experience at both the major college and professional levels got the attention of Bustle.

While at FIU, Brown teamed with current Cajuns defensive coordinator Kevin Fouquier to lead FIU's fourth ranked pass defense in 2005, which was bested by only Virginia Tech, Wisconsin and Louisiana State.

Brown's disciples at FIU included Greg Moss, a priority free-agent signing of the Atlanta Falcons and Kevin Timothee a free agent with the Tennessee Titans, New York Giants and NFL Europe's Amsterdam Admirals.

Brown has seven years of professional playing experience including one year with the Washington Redskins and one year with the San Francisco 49ers. He spent his college playing career under Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Erickson at the University of Miami (1988-91) and won two national championships.

Brown signed as a free agent with the Redskins in 1992 and later with the 49ers. He went to play for the Sacramento Gold Miners, San Antonio Texans and Montreal Alouettes of the Canadian Football League from 1993-97.

Following his CFL career, he joined the coaching ranks at Dillard High School in Fort Lauderdale in May 1998. In May 1999, Brown returned to his prep alma mater, Merritt Island High School, serving as special teams coord./defensive backs coach before joining FIU in 2001.

He served as an undergraduate assistant to Erickson, coaching defensive backs at Miami in 1992. Brown coached the defensive secondary under Erickson and defensive coordinator Sonny Lubick.

Brown was a football and academic standout at Merritt Island High School, where he graduated in May 1987 and later earned a scholarship to Miami.

**Kevin Fouquier**

Kevin Fouquier came home to Louisiana in 2007 to serve in the role of Cajuns defensive coordinator. In his first season, four players on Fouquier's defense earned All-Sun Belt honors, including true freshman Grant Fleming. Fleming became the first Cajuns freshman on defense to ever earn a spot on an all-conference team. In addition, Rodney Hardeaway (St. Louis Rams) and Kyle Ward (Green Bay Packers) signed NFL free agent contracts.

The Cajuns saw two more defensive players earn All-Sun Belt accolades in 2008 and three more in 2009. Hall Davis was selected in the fifth round of the 2010 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams.

The Cajuns defense, known by their motto, TNT (tackles and turnovers), continues to improve - allowing fewer points, less yards per game and creating more turnovers for the second straight year. In 2009, the Cajuns 16 interceptions were the most since 1994 and UL ranked 23rd in the NCAA in picks. The defense ranked 29th nationally in turnovers gained and was 6-2 in games where the defense forced at least two turnovers.

Fouquier came to UL after having served as defensive coordinator/defensive line coach at FIU in 2006. In his only season, FIU improved in six key statistical categories from the previous year. FIU led the Sun Belt in total defense and ranked 27th in the nation - just one year after finishing 76th in the nation in total defense. FIU's fourth ranked pass defense, up from 52nd in 2005, led the SBC and was bested by only Virginia Tech, Wisconsin and LSU. In addition, the Golden Panthers led the nation in tackles for loss.

Prior to his stint at FIU, Fouquier spent five seasons at Middle Tennessee, the last three as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator. He coached the linebackers for three seasons and the defensive linemen for two seasons.

The Blue Raiders shared the SBC title during his first season, while their scoring defense led the SBC, and was 17th in the nation, during his final season.

No stranger to Louisiana, Fouquier, a Franklin native, is a 1989 Louisiana graduate. He was a student assistant coach throughout his undergraduate years, 1985-89, as the Cajuns went 29-26 during that span - including four straight winning seasons under head coach Nelson Stokley.

Four seasons removed from a brief stretch as defensive coordinator at Teurlings High School in the spring of 1991, Fouquier would land at Louisiana Tech. He was the defensive line coach for five seasons from 1995-99, adding recruiting coordinator responsibilities in 1998.

**Ron Hudson**

Ron Hudson has held many responsibilities since joining the Cajuns in 2005, serving as offensive coordinator and offensive line coach.

In his five seasons at UL, Hudson has seen 12 All-Sun Belt performers along the offensive line, including a pair of three-time All-SBC players, one of which was the third overall selection in the 2008 Canadian Football League Draft.

The Cajuns have produced a dominant running game that ranked 7th in 2005, 2007 and 2008 and 11th in 2006. UL switched gears in 2009, becoming a top passing team. The offensive line responded quickly to the transition from heavy run-blocking to more pass protection. The Cajuns were just five completions from the school record with 43 fewer attempts and quarterback Chris Masson threw for 2,406 yards, the fourth best single-season in school history. The offensive line did not allow a sack until the second quarter of the fourth game of the season (over 195 minutes without a sack) and finished the season 13th in the country in fewest sacks allowed.

Hudson's offensive line in 2005 helped set a school record with 2,797 rushing yards and 34 rushing touchdowns. In addition, UL allowed only nine sacks - the fourth best total in the country. That rushing record didn't stand long, as the 2007 team ran for 3,019 yards, including 1,000-yard rushing performances from quarterback Michael Desormeaux and running back Tyrell Fenroy. Louisiana became the first team in Sun Belt history to ever rush for over 3,000 yards. The offensive line ranked 19th nationally in fewest sacks allowed.

The school rushing record was broken again in 2008 (3,164 yards), with Fenroy becoming just the seventh player in NCAA history with four 1,000-yard rushing seasons and Desormeaux becoming just the eighth quarterback in NCAA history with back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons.

Hudson came to UL after serving as the offensive line coach at Texas A&M-Kingsville, where he coached three all-conference players, including Roy Stroud, who was a Division II All-American. In addition, TAMU-Kingsville was ranked as one of the top five Division II programs in the nation.

A native of Columbus, Ohio, Hudson received bachelor's degrees in physical education and history from Muskingum College in New Concord, Ohio in 1987. He led the Fighting Muskies to a 29-10 record during his four years, the winningest stretch in school history. Hudson earned all-conference honors as a junior and senior and an academic all-conference accolade as a senior.

He and his wife Melissa are the proud parents of three children, daughter Mackenzie and sons Spencer and David.

**Justin Lustig**

Justin Lustig was added to the football coaching staff in 2009. He coaches the running backs and special teams.

In his first season, Lustig helped develop a young group of running backs after his senior starter was lost for the season. Redshirt freshman Yobes Walker ran for over 100 yards in his first collegiate start.

Lustig's impact was felt immediately in the area of special teams, his kickoff and punt coverage units both ranked 26th nationally.

Lustig came to the Cajuns from Eastern Illinois, where he also coached the running backs and special teams.

Under Lustig, the Panthers produced a different 1,000-yard rusher in each of his three seasons. He tutored Vincent Webb in 2006 to a 1,439-yard rushing season and coached Ademola Adeniji, who ran for 1,287 yards and 15 touchdowns in 2007. Last season, EIU saw Travorus Bess rush for 1,086 yards.

In 2008, the Panthers were 11th in the FCS in punt returns and led their conference in punting, punt returns and kickoff coverage.

Lustig's special teams unit was among the nation's best in 2007 with freshman punter Kevin Cook ranking 4th in the nation in punting and earning honorable mention All-America honors. During that season, the Panthers special teams returned one kickoff for a TD, blocked one punt for a TD and blocked one field goal. EIU ranked 4th nationally in net punting and 18th in kickoff returns.

During the 2006 season, EIU ranked 18th nationally kick return defense.

Prior to joining EIU, Lustig coached defensive backs and special teams for two years (2004-05) at NCAA Division III-Christopher Newport University in Newport News, Va. His 2005 team blocked 11 kicks and scored six touchdowns as the Captains ranked either first or second in every special teams category in the USA South Atlantic Conference. In total, he coached eight All-Conference players, including the 2005 Conference Defensive Player of the Year.

In 2003 he coached cornerbacks at Villanova University which was ranked as high as No. 4 in that year's NCAA I-AA football poll.

Lustig began his coaching career at Christopher Newport in 2001, serving as the team's recruiting coordinator and secondary coach for two seasons.

A four year starter at Bucknell University (1997-2000), Lustig was a team captain at cornerback and safety. He also holds a masters degree in education and human development from George Washington University.

**Daryl Mason** is an experienced coach who has spent over a decade coaching in the state of Louisiana, including each year since 2000. He joined Rickey Bustle's staff after serving as wide receivers coach at Tulane from 2004 through 2006.

Mason helped Jason Chery earn All-Sun Belt honors in 2008, as Chery vaulted into the Cajuns top 10 in career receiving yards.

In 2007, 16 different Cajuns made at least one reception, while 18 different players caught at least one pass in 2008. Both seasons, UL ranked in the top five in the nation in terms of spreading the ball around.

At Tulane, Mason's receiving corps managed to amass over 2,000 yards receiving each season and nearly hit 3,000 yards receiving in 2006, accumulating 2,958 yards. He coached three All-Conference USA receivers, including standout Jeremy Williams, who was named honorable-mention Freshman All-American by The Sporting News. Mason also coached Roydell Williams who went on to become the Green Wave's all-time leader in touchdown catches and was a fourth-round draft choice of the Tennessee Titans in the 2005 NFL Draft.

Prior to joining the Tulane staff, Mason completed his third stint at Northwestern State where he was the offensive coordinator and receivers coach for two seasons (2002-2003), helping the Demons to the I-AA playoffs in 2002. His 2003 NSU offense broke the school record for points in a season.

He spent the 2001 season as receivers coach at Louisiana-Monroe.

Before returning to Louisiana in 2000, Mason spent four seasons at East Tennessee State. His ETSU receivers set 12 school records and B.J. Adigun earned I-AA All-American honors in 1997 after posting 1,380 yards on 72 catches.

Mason was a 1977 prep All-American at Little Rock's Parkview High School and was named Arkansas' high school Athlete of the Year in 1978. He was a three-year starter at tight end for head coach Lou Holtz at Arkansas from 1978-81.

He earned a bachelor's degree from Arkansas in 1983 and began his coaching career in 1984 on Holtz' staff at Minnesota working as a graduate assistant.

**Jorge Munoz**

In 2008, **Jorge Munoz** was added to the Cajuns staff as the Quarterbacks Coach and Passing Game Coordinator. One of his main responsibilities is play calling. In his first season calling plays, the Cajuns offense ranked 13th in the nation and 24th overall in scoring. That same season, Munoz helped Michael Desormeaux record the second most yards of total offense in school history. Desormeaux was named the 2008 Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Year.

The Cajuns "Play Station" attack of 2008 shattered the school record for total offense with 5,390 yards, besting the 1995 record of 4,780 yards.

The offense continued to thrive with Munoz calling the plays in 2009, as 16 different players scored a touchdown. Quarterback Chris Masson threw for 2,406 yards passing, the fourth best single-season total in school history. He came within two completions of tying the school single-season mark as well. The Cajuns ranked 16th in the NCAA in red zone efficiency.

Prior to UL, Munoz spent three seasons at Eastern Illinois. He was promoted to Offensive Coordinator in March 2007 after being named co-Offensive Coordinator in the summer of 2006. Under his direction, EIU ran a more diverse offense in 2006, with four players earning first team All-Ohio Valley honors, including OVC co-Offensive Player of the Year Vincent Webb and third team All-American Micah Rucker. The Panthers ranked 18th in the nation in rushing and either first or second in the OVC in rushing, total offense and pass efficiency.

EIU's offense in 2007 had a 1,000-yard rusher for the fourth straight season with five Panthers earning first team All-OVC honors and three players earning honorable mention All-America honors. EIU ranked 33rd in the nation in scoring and 36th in the country in rushing yards.

Munoz spent two seasons as the wide receivers coach at Charleston Southern (2003-04). During the 2004 season, Charleston Southern wide receivers ranked first, second and fourth in the Big South Conference. The Buccaneers passing offense ranked first in the Big South and 17th in the NCAA.

The 2002 offense at Anderson University ranked fifth in DIII passing and set six school records, while the 2001 offense ranked sixth in passing and set 22 school records. His quarterback was the MVP of the HCAC both seasons.

A 1998 graduate of Bethany College, Munoz was a two-time All-American quarterback. He played one year in the Arena Football League with the Albany (NY) Firebirds. Munoz was a multi-sport standout at San Diego Hilltop HS.

He and his wife Erin, have two children - Ava and Alex.

**Tim Rebowe**

**Tim Rebowe** has strong ties to the state of Louisiana, having coached his entire career in the Pelican State. Rebowe coached the Ragin' Cajuns safeties from 2004-07 and began tutoring the linebackers in 2008.

Rebowe helped guide Antwyne Zanders and Grant Fleming, who ranked first and second in total tackles in 2009, respectively. Both players were named All-Sun Belt Conference. For Zanders it was his third All-SBC recognition, while Fleming has twice earned the honor.

The Cajuns pass defense had a stellar first year under Rebowe, finishing with a No. 11 national ranking in passing yards allowed. Both of Rebowe's starting safeties in 2004 advanced to the NFL.

Rebowe coached strong safety C.C. Brown (101 tackles), who was drafted by the Houston Texans in the 2004 NFL Draft, and free safety Antwain Spann, who signed as a free agent with the New York Giants. Spann played in NFL Europe and with the New England Patriots.

In 2005, the Cajuns pass defense was 23rd nationally, allowing only 190 yards per game despite opponents facing an uphill climb in eight games. The Cajuns trailed after three quarters just twice in 2005.

Rebowe has also coached a pair of exemplary student-athletes in Lamar Morgan, a NFF Hampshire Honor Society member and a Draddy Award semifinalist, and Johnny Felders, currently coaching at Istrouma High School.

Rebowe came to UL after three seasons as cornerbacks coach at ULM. Prior to his stint with the Warhawks, Rebowe spent six years at Nicholls State where he served as defensive backs coach (1995-2000), special teams' coordinator (1995-98), recruiting coordinator (1998-2000), and wide receivers coach (2000). In 1996, the Colonels pass efficiency defense ranked seventh nationally in I-AA.

The native of Norco, La., began his coaching career in 1987 at his alma mater, Destrehan High School.

His ties to the Cajuns began in 1994 when former Destrehan High star Damon Mason transferred to Louisiana from Jones County JC. Mason would go on to have one of the best careers by a defensive back in Cajuns history.

Rebowe earned his bachelor of science in physical education from Louisiana State University in 1987. He is married to the former Kim Robichaux and they have a daughter, Samantha, and a son, Tyler.

Former Cajuns standout **Troy Wingerter** is the longest tenured coach on the football staff, having started his career with the athletic department in 1997. Wingerter has served in the role of Cajuns' tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator since 2002, adding assistant head coach duties in 2009.

Wingerter coached the defensive ends in 2001 under then-head coach Jerry Baldwin. He was the tight ends coach as a graduate assistant from 1997-99 under both Nelson Stokley and Baldwin.

In 2009, tight end Luke Aubrey led the team in receptions while fellow tight end Ladarius Green topped the team in yards.

Green was a mid-season addition to the 2009 Mackey Award Watch List - one of three underclassmen on the 22-man midseason list. He also earned All-Sun Belt Honors. Green (54-801, 7 TD) is on pace to be one of the top receivers in school history.

Wingerter tutored a pair of red zone targets in Kevin Belton and Luke Aubrey in 2007 and 2008, respectively. Both players had six receptions, but each caught three for touchdowns.

Wingerter coached Josh Joerg during his All-Sun Belt season in 2002. After earning his undergraduate degree in 1993, Wingerter embarked on a four-year career in corporate business working in Lafayette, New Orleans, Colorado and Montana.

A native of New Orleans, Wingerter was a first-team All-Louisiana selection and an All-South Independent pick as a senior in 1991. He helped guide the Cajuns to three straight winning seasons during his first three years from 1987-89 and was a permanent team captain as a senior.

In addition, he was selected as a member of the All-Time Louisiana-Lafayette football team as compiled by the Lafayette Daily Advertiser.





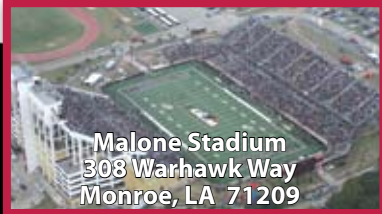
